

**11 - Baw Du Pha IDP Camps** (estimated 11,000 residents)

<b>Issue</b>	<b>Status</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ SECURITY: Continued concerns from humanitarian agencies and IDPs regarding Military security office at camp.</li> <li>➤ CAMP MANAGEMENT: Ongoing regular activities, information sharing, information gathering and daily access to services monitoring.               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ SHELTER MAINTENANCE: shelter concerns remain key concern; roofs are badly damaged throughout the camp.</li> </ul> </li> <li>➤ WASH: Ongoing regular activities; camp and latrine cleaning, desludging, monitoring WASH activities.</li> <li>➤ HEALTH: MHAA and Mercy Malaysia open clinic 2 days per week.</li> <li>➤ DEATHS<sup>2</sup>: A new born baby and 50 year old man died of unknown causes.</li> <li>➤ FOOD: Food distribution for May had finished - rice only. WFP will deliver remaining food next week.</li> <li>➤ PROTECTION: New women's group established. Main concerns raised: difficulty accessing health services for emergency, esp. pregnancy related; lack of NFIs; need for electricity near latrines due to safety risks. No updates re: lack of firewood.</li> <li>➤ EDUCATION: All TLS start to register students for the new school years. No student kits were provided for new school seasons.</li> <li>➤ NON-FOOD ITEM: No NFI core kits distributed since the establishment of the camp. IDP complained that NFIs are distributed in other camps but not in BDP.</li> <li>➤ NUTRITION: ACF and SCI nutrition centre is running and provide nutrition assistance. SCI conduct hygiene promotion sessions to mothers of &lt;5 children and provided baby clothes to new born baby and necessary medicine to those children.</li> <li>➤ CHILD PROTECTION: Regular activities ongoing, CFSs operational; no updates.</li> </ul>	<p>-Concerns raised by CCCM with government counterparts – awaiting update.</p> <p>-Roof repair work by DRC is expected to begin next week– Request to use provided tarpaulins.</p> <p>-No update from Health Cluster re: suspected hepatitis case.</p> <p>-Protection concerns followed up by DRC Protection team.</p> <p>-NFI sector is aware.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ SECURITY: No incidents reported.</li> <li>➤ CAMP MANAGEMENT: Ongoing regular activities, information sharing, information gathering and daily access to services monitoring.               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ SHELTER: Lack of shelter for IDPs in sector 4; high risk during the upcoming rainy season.</li> <li>▪ SHELTER MAINTENANCE: shelter roofs are badly damaged throughout the camp.</li> </ul> </li> <li>➤ WASH: Ongoing regular activities: cleaning latrines and camp, hygiene promotion, latrines and hand pump renovation, meeting with CMC for drainage construction.</li> <li>➤ HEALTH: MHAA operated a clinic out of DP hospital. SCI is conducted reproductive health related hygiene promotion.</li> <li>➤ DEATHS<sup>3</sup>: A 6-month old baby died of unknown causes.</li> <li>➤ FOOD: A private donor, MAUK, provided 720 rice bags for IDPs in sector 4 and tent areas.</li> <li>➤ NON-FOOD ITEM: No NFI kits been delivered by agencies – primary concern, cooking utensils.</li> </ul>	<p>-Follow up taking place.</p> <p>Roof repair work by DRC is expected to begin in next 2 weeks.</p> <p>- No update from Health Cluster re: suspected hepatitis case.</p> <p>-NFI cluster aware.</p>
