

SITE UPDATES

National CCCM Cluster

- On the 21 and 22 February, the CCCM and Protection clusters held a joint workshop to bring actors working on CCCM and the prevention of gender-based violence (GBV) together from different field locations. Participants revised and developed tools for mainstreaming GBV prevention and mitigation in field-level implementation of camp management activities.

Wau PoC Site and Collective Centers

Wau PoC 200

- Congestion intensified at the Episcopal Church of South Sudan (ECS) site, with 1,222 new arrivals from Jur River county and 461 exits recorded over the reporting period. Local authorities plan to relocate internally displaced persons (IDPs) from ECS to an area called Massna Talib, however, focus group discussions indicate that people do not wish to move noting that they do not trust local authorities to provide adequate protection. The CCCM Cluster raised this at the Inter-Cluster Working Group and will work closely with the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs to advocate to allow IDPs to stay at the site and for humanitarians to start urgently needed shelter construction.

Bentiu PoC Site

Bentiu PoC 118,851

- Camp management have been engaging with protection partners, the UN Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS) Relief, Reintegration and Protection (RRP) team and UN Police to make preparations for International Women's Day celebrations. The celebration will be held on 13 March, with speeches, prayers, drama, music and singing.
- CCCM partner Internews distributed 846 radios to Bentiu town, Rubkona, Dingding, Pakur, Kaljak, Niemni, Guit and Tong. Internews are currently in discussion with the local government to restart the radio station Kondial 97.2 FM, which will broadcast throughout the protection of civilian (PoC) site and in surrounding areas. Once restarted, the broadcasting system will serve as a vital tool to communicate key information to people in the PoC site and nearby communities.

Bor PoC Site

Bor PoC 1,976

- Camp management provided support to the shelter partner currently facing challenges in procuring local materials. As the demand for shelter materials has been increasing in the PoC site, camp management has been identifying and assessing the most urgent shelter cases through the complaints and feedback mechanism and distributing plastic sheets and bamboos.

Juba UN House PoC Site

UN House PoC 1 and PoC 3 38,942

- Following agreement with the community, rehabilitation has started on the PoC 3 health clinic to allow the health partner to recommence services in April 2017. The facility was closed at the request of the community in November 2016 due to false rumours.

Malakal PoC Site

Malakal PoC 30,575

- Camp Management received 12 elderly new arrivals who were fleeing fighting in Wau Shilluk. All individuals were reunited with family members living in the PoC site with assistance from community leaders and announcements through the Internews radio.

Melut PoC Site and Displacement Sites

Melut PoC 681
Dethomas 20,153

- The CCCM and Protection clusters conducted a two-day assessment to ascertain the intentions of IDPs residing at the PoC site and at the New Paloich School with regard to returning to their areas of origin. A total of 450 residents in the PoC site and 172 people residing at the school were reached as respondents.
