UNHCR updates

- **Kalobeyei**
 - Population rapidly increasing due to relocation from Dadaab and influx from South Sudan, which has posed a challenge to respond to immediate education needs. The only primary school has a population of about 10,000 pupils.
 - 2 primary schools to be opened on 12th June 2017. UNICEF will support in additional cost.
 - 1 temporary secondary school to cater from students relocated from Dadaab who were left out of the 50 scholarships.
- There is need to improve on monitoring and quality assurance in schools by partners.
- Fight fraud and corruption as its affecting the running of operation in areas such as teacher recruitments, scholarships and admission to secondary/boarding schools.
- Need to develop Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) especially in the recruitment of teachers, deployment of staff, student admissions and scholarships especially in secondary education. SGBV cases referral to boarding schools.
- Need to develop a checklist with other partners which will be circulated before recruitment of teachers.
- SOPs should be shared with refugee leaders.
- There was a suggestion on developing a matrix so as to improve on our systems.

Partner's updates

WVI

- Implementing ECAP project-empowering Youth about peace building, working with clubs.
- Bio-sanitation project,
 - Initiated at Kakuma secondary but outcome not realized because of contamination-currently under rehabilitation to improve the facility.
 - Project intended to roll out in Mournau Sheppel. Contractors are on the ground to start the work.
 - Conversion of latrines at MS to be done in August.
- Need for coordination with WTK.

WTK

- KEEP programmes and remedial classes starting in the schools and extending to secondary school.
- Recruitment of teachers at the temporary secondary school in KAlobeyei ongoing.
- Borderless for higher education collaborating with Kenyatta University in offering Diploma in Primary and Secondary education (accredited by TSC) from the accredited university.

BHER

- Presence in dadaab- a centre in Dadaab with 350 students so far in various levels.

- York University Collaborating with Kenyatta University in offering Diploma in Primary and Secondary education (accredited by TSC) from the accredited university.
- Face to face and online methods.
- Ethiopians are a majority in the programme , 10 students in the program relocated to Kalobeyei
- Funding coming to an end in 2018.

DRC

- 55 students enrolled in Turkana University and MMUST.
- Plans to enroll more students in Kalobeyei.

AAR

- Constructions done and handed over to WTK through UNHCR.
- Implementing Guidance and Counselling.

JRS

- Teacher trainees to graduate on 24th July.
- Youth empowerment.

NRC

- Expansion of training programme in Kakuma-expansion of infrastructure construction ongoing.
- Training starting in Kalobeyei in June.

LWF

- Participation of B/Naam and A/Jolie girls in co-curricular activities up to county level. A/Jolie proceeded to Regional level and will be reciting one choral verse at the National level.
- Joint and successful Education Day with partners implementing education.

DON BOSCO

- Exams for secretarial and Agricultural courses planned to take place.

UNHCR-Information Management Officer presentation

- In the process of developing sectoral dashboards, starting with Education. First page containing numbers/statistics and second page narrative-achievements/challenges.
- Logos for every agency is implementing education will be included.

WFP

- Will provide wet feeding for the new schools in Kalobeyei LWF has submitted request.
