# CCCM overall aims

**CCCM is a priority and cross-cutting global Cluster.**

- **Coordination** of humanitarian services and actors in the camps
- **Identification of gaps and needs** in terms of protection and assistance in and among camps
- Provide partners with **systematic information** on camp residents, humanitarian services and gaps
- Ensure that assistance and protection is provided **uniformly in all camps**, in line with common technical standards and policy guidance
- Ensure systematic and meaningful **participation** of the camp residents in all aspects of camp life
- Ensure mainstreaming of **cross-cutting issues** including protection, environment, HIV/AIDS and age, gender and diversity

# CCCM overall mission

Three key roles and responsibilities have been agreed upon to ensure effective response at all levels:

## 1. Camp Management

National authorities at camp and inter-camp level

## 3. Camp Coordination

Inter-camp level coordination
