# CCCM in Rakhine

- 139.107 overall population
- **83%, 114.760 living in camps** (30 planned, 4 Self Settled)
- 75%, 86.537 in Sittwe Township
- 17%, 19.976 in Pauktaw Township

# **CM related issues in Sittwe Muslim rural area**

**Khaung Doke Khar (361 HHs, 2108 ind)**

- **9 Villages**

- **Current situation :**

- **Committee 1:**

Self appointed, 28 members (20 IDPs and 8 HC, 1 Village Admin and his antagonist, no women)

- **Committee 2:**

Appointed by the Township Admin, 15 members, all IDPs, no decision-making power, no women

Host community representatives rule, distribute food, alleged selling of items

IDPs accused of stealing items from host community

# **CM related issues in Sittwe Muslim rural area**

## **Proposal to Village Administrator:**

- Dissolve existing committees
- Election new CMC: 10 members, 1 Camp Leader and 1 rep. per each village, ToR including services provision
- Election of Women Committee
- Regular inter-committee meeting schedule
- Empower Village Administrator, ToR
- Food: distributed by the IDPs, more external supervision from CDN

# **CM related issues in Sittwe Muslim rural area**

Land ownership issue in OTG 2

- Latrines construction, solved?

# CCCM Information Management System

1. Camp List, including statistics
2. Dashboard
3. **Camp Profiling Tool, under construction and revision:**

## **General data:**

- Camp name, P-code, township, GPS coordinates, type of accommodation, opening date
- Camp profiling responsible organization

## **Population:**

- # Individuals, # HHs
- Disaggregated data, age and sex
- Ethnicity (?)
- Specific needs (PWG)

# Camp Profiling tool

## **Shelter and Settlement:**

- Average camp area per person (30-45 m<sup>2</sup>)
- Average dwelling floor size per person (m<sup>2</sup>)
- % of HH living in adequate dwellings (long houses)

## **Camp Management:**

- Camp Management Agency (permanent or mobile) assigned to the site (y/n)
- Percentage of female members in the Camp Management Committee (50%)
- Camp Women Committee (y/n)
- Percentage of Camp Management Committee members (M-F) that attended CCCM induction training (100 %)
- Anonymous complaints mechanism in place for camp residents (y/n)

# Camp Profiling tool

## **WASH:**

### Proposed by the WASH Cluster in Sittwe:

- % of IDPs who have access to at least 15 liters of safe water per person per day for drinking, cooking and personal hygiene
- % of IDPs who have access to an accessible, appropriate toilet, allocated based on gender - at 20 users per latrine stance
- % of people washing hands with soap at critical times

### Recommended by CCCM Cluster:

- Average quantity of water available per person per day (15-20 liters)
- Number of persons per usable water tap (200-250 pax)
- Number of persons per seat\drop hole in communal latrines (20-100)
- Percentage of population provided with 450g of bathing soap per month per person

# Camp Profiling tool

## **Nutrition:**

### Proposed by WFP:

- Average number of kilocalories available per person per day (> 2100)

### Proposed by UNICEF-Nutrition:

- % of PLW receive micronutrients supplement
- % of 6-59 months receive micronutrients supplement
- GAM
- SAM/MAM

# Camp Profiling tool

## **Health:**

### Recommended by the CCCM Cluster:

- CMR (< 1 death/10,000 persons/day)
- U5MR (0.8 – 1.2)
- Number of persons per primary health care facility (< 10,000)

### From Kachin:

- Functioning health facility available within the camp (y/n)
- Distance between the camp and the nearest accessible health facility (miles, time)

# Camp Profiling tool

## **Protection:**

### Proposed by the Protection WG:

- Type of security on the site (multiple choice: CMC/camp residents/Security Committee Police/army)
- Presence of security (multiple choice: 24/7, day/night time, time-to-time patrolling)
- PWSNs:
  - Disabled (physically or mentally),
  - Chronically ill
  - Unaccompanied children (<18)
  - Separated children (<18)
  - Unaccompanied elders (>60)
  - PLW
  - Single Headed Households

# Camp Profiling tool

## **Education:**

### Proposed by UNICEF:

- % of primary students provided with the essential learning package
- # of TLS built and provided with school furniture
- % of children aged 3-5 accessing ECDS (early childhood development centre) service
- # of volunteer teacher per camp/TLS

### From Kachin:

- Distance between the camp and the nearest accessible primary school:

- Relocation exercise stand-by teams
- Pauktaw: committees assessment, empowerment for rainy season
