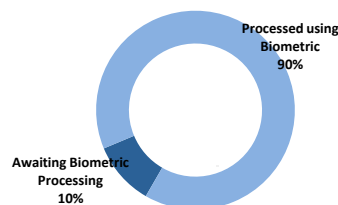

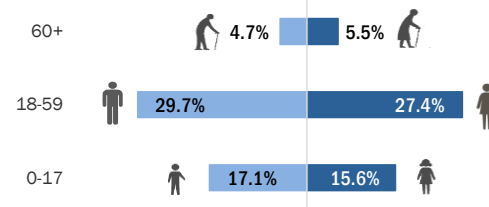

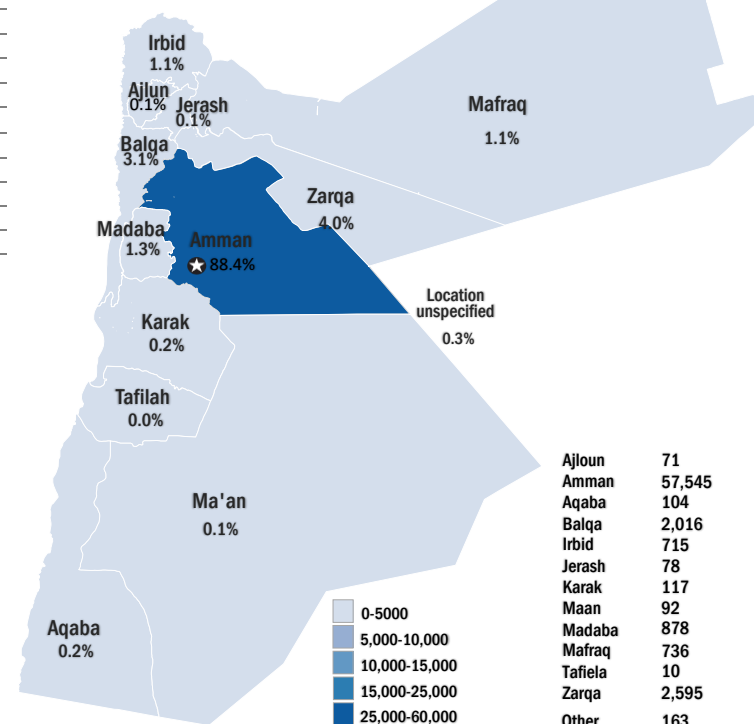

Age-Gender Breakdown



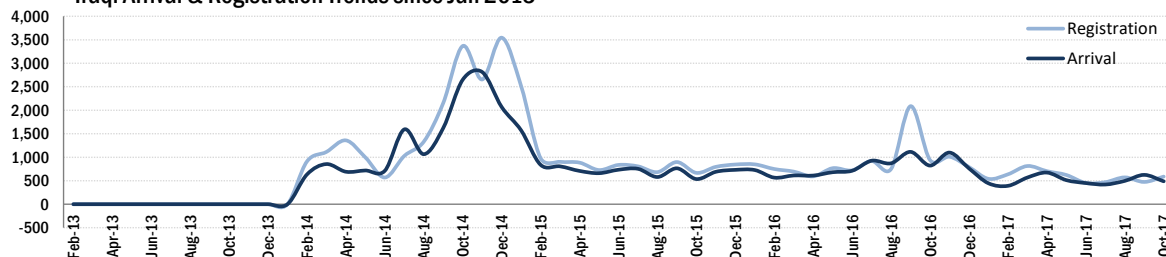
