

## Libya: Rescue at Sea, monthly update

UNHCR LIBYA JUNE 2017

Libya continues to be the main departure and transit point for departure from North Africa towards Europe. As of 30 June 2017, the Libyan Coast Guard rescued/intercepted a total of 8,165 people in different locations along the Libyan coast. Since 1 January 2017, Libyan local authorities have recovered 389 bodies of people who drowned while attempting to cross the Mediterranean towards Europe. UNHCR through its partner International Medical Corps is present in six health posts at disembarkation points, at Azzwaya, Tripoli (3), Tajoura (Al Hamidiyah) and Alkhums, where it provides medical and hygiene assistance.

### Monthly trends - people rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2016-2017

From January to June 2017, **8,165 people** were rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard, a decrease of **11%** compared to the same period in 2016.

Nearly **65%** of the total number were rescued/intercepted at Azzawya.




### Monthly trends - recorded loss of life in Libyan waters in 2016-2017

From January to June 2017, **389 dead bodies** were recovered in Libyan waters, compared to 506 over the same period in 2016.




### People rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2017 by group

Of the total of 8,165 people rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard, **7,314** were men, **755 women** and **96 children**.



### UNHCR health posts at disembarkation points $\widehat{H}$

As of 30 June 2017, UNHCR, through its partner International Medical Corps, provided **medical assistance** to **1,619 people** and distributed **1,605 hygiene kits** at six health posts.
