
Children arriving in 2017 Accompanied 9% UASC 91% 15,540 UASC 13% of sea arrivals


Italy - Unaccompanied and Separated Children (UASC) Dashboard

Between 1 January and 30 November 2017, 15,540 unaccompanied and separated children arrived in Italy by sea, representing 13% of all sea arrivals in this period. Similarly, 14 per cent of those arriving in the same period last year were UASC. The numbers of UASC arriving by sea, however, have decreased compared to last year, when over 24,600 UASC were registered at landing points in the January-November period.




UASC arriving by sea in the first eleven months of 2017 most commonly originate from Guinea (1,886), Côte d'Ivoire (1,620), The Gambia (1,407), Bangladesh (1,309), Nigeria (1,220), and Eritrea (1,200). During this period, significant numbers of UASC arrivals also originate from Mali (986), Somalia (930), Senegal (743), Syrian Arab Republic (568), Tunisia (529), and Sudan (496).

Relatively higher proportions of UASC are recorded among arrivals from Somalia (33% are UASC), Syrian Arab Republic (25%), The Gambia (24%), Iraq (23%), Guinea (20%), and Eritrea (18%). While Eritreans were the largest UASC group to arrive between January and November 2016 (3,714), their numbers decreased by more than two thirds in the January-November 2017 period. Also, the numbers of Gambian UASC registered at landing points in the first eleven months of 2017 decreased by 55% compared to the same period last year.

Most UASC arriving by sea are boys and are 16 and 17 years old. However, exact figures on gender of UASC arrivals are currently unavailable.
