

## STRATEGIC RESPONSE

In 2018, RRP partners in Cameroon will assist 100,000 refugees (most of whom are settled in Minawao camp) and 45,000 hosts. Assistance will also be expanded to out of camp refugees in remote areas. It is expected that approximately 25,000 refugees (20,000 assisted / 5,000 self-organized) may wish to return to Nigeria in 2018, within the framework of the Tripartite Agreement signed on 2 March 2017. Ensuring access to asylum and maintaining its civilian and humanitarian character will constitute key protection priorities. These efforts will be reinforced by increased monitoring along Cameroon's border. Activities carried out for host communities will include livelihood interventions, ensuring the upkeep of infrastructures and providing basic services. Partners will reinforce the capacities of host communities and promote their self-reliance. Still, the key operational priority for 2018-2020 lies in providing durable solutions, such as local integration or facilitated voluntary return, in accordance with the Tripartite Agreement.

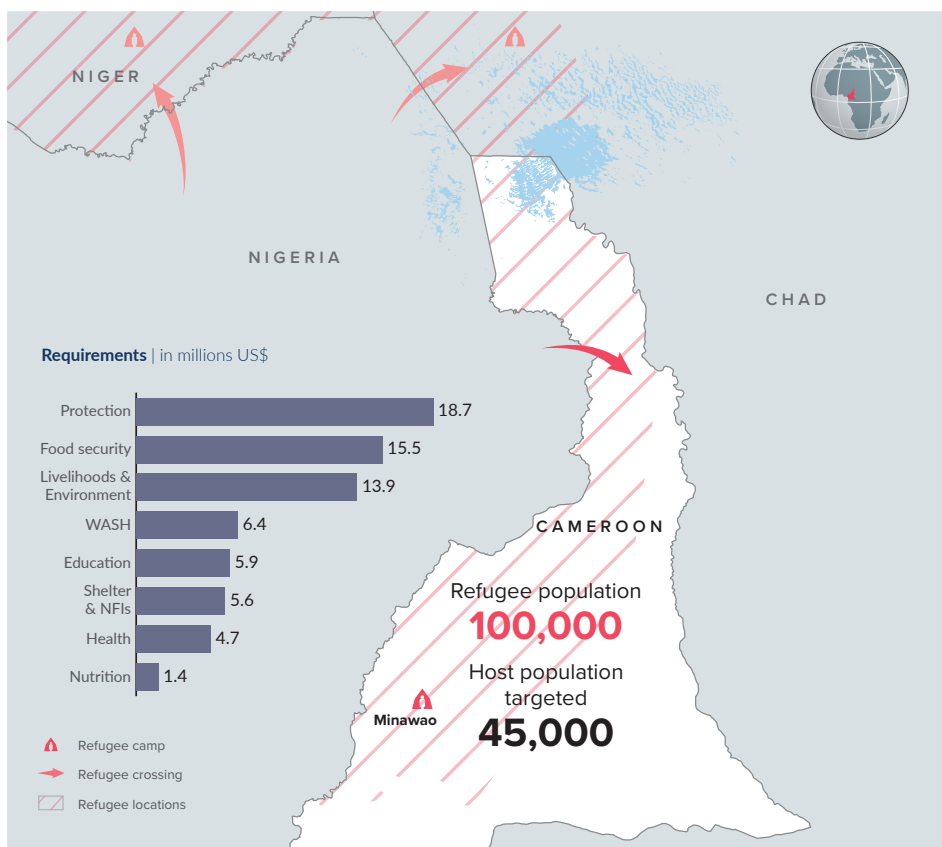
