







MAIN REFUGEE LOCATIONS BY HOST COUNTRY



REGIONS OF ORIGIN OF SOMALI REFUGEES AND ASYLUM-SEEKERS



An estimated 171,000 Somalis whose areas of origin information is unknown/unspecified are not shown on the map. These include 149,000 Somalis in Yemen, and some 14,000 Somalis in Ethiopia, Kenya and Uganda. Areas of origin statistics as of 31 March 2017 or latest available.

Dollo Ado includes Buramino, Bokolmanyo, Hilaweyne, Kobe and Melkaidida refugee camps. Dadaab includes Dagahaley, Hagadera, Ifo and Ifo 2 refugee camps. Jijiga includes Awbarre, Kebribeyah and Sheder refugee camps. South-Western Uganda includes Nakivale, Kyaka II, Kyangwali and Kiryandongo refugee camps.
