While Refugee Response Plan (RRP) exists for countries affected by Influx of South Sudan, document targeting the overall Ethiopia operation does not yet exist. In addition, donors would like to understand the funding requirements of the partners by population group and have a comprehensive view of the needs of the refugee operation. Country Operation Plan (COP)	The annual COP planning meeting will be on 19 <sup>th</sup> March 2018 and invitation will be sent to partners. The meeting in Addis Ababa will be followed by a COP exercise in the regions. The COP will show strategic direction with focus on CRRF		

Feedback on joint qualitative nutrition assessment Afar	Joint assessment was carried out in Afar refugee camps to understand the reasons of persistently high acute malnutrition rate. Underlying causes identified were. But it is stressed that it is important to identify which one have significant bearing as underlying cause.  • Absence of other livelihood opportunities compared with other camps.  • Loss resulting from exchange with other food and debt paying of borrowed food.  • Ration spent for buying other food and non-food commodities like soap and vegetables.  • Misconception that milk is superior to Plumpynut.  • Absence of adequate household fuel resulting in significant time spent on searching collecting fire-wood.  • Poor maternal time and infant and child-caring practices.  • Low frequency of feeding of a child, usually 1 – 2 times per day.  • Inadequate water storage capacity.  • Low proportion of exclusive breast feeding  • High payment for transportation of food items, 100 birr for donkey transport.  • Low staff capacity: Low ratio of COA, training of CMAM, IYCFP  • High incidence of diarrhoea.  • Inadequate distribution of soap
Partners update	Goal submitted consortium application to improve shelter and other sectors in Afar.  Maternity Foundation conducted training for health staff in Basic Emergency Obstetrics Care in Gambella, using the Safe Delivery App.
	Concern is undertaking documentation of success stories on backyard gardening and sack gardening (where there is shortage of water) which could be shared with partners.

	WFP updated on pipe-line situation. Shortage is expected on General food distribution with further ration cuts while supplies for nutrition programme will be adequate for the next 3 – 4 months. WFP will to take measure after exhausting all options and communicate with ARRA and UNHCR.  WFP emphasises the need for avoiding loss of food due to expiration and improper storage.  UNHCR in collaboration with AAH will undertake Response Analyses Workshop in Gambella on 14 and 15 March 2018.  UNHCR will undertake Joint SENS in Melkadida on the 3 <sup>rd</sup> week of March, 2018	
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
