<p><b><u>JRP 3 pillars updates: Access, Quality and Systems Strengthening:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ <b>Advocacy and resource mobilization:</b> Jordan ESWG finalized Jordan chapter of NLG report to be launched and disseminated during donor conference in Brussels on 24 April 2018. The report contains education achievement made in 2017 including challenges, lessons learnt and challenges.</li> <li>➤ <b>Access:</b> MoE confirmed that 130,668 Syrian children refugees attend formal school for 2017-2018 increased from 126,127 in 2016-2017 across Jordan. Despite an increased enrolment in formal education, estimated 72,137 children are still out-of-school. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Early childhood education (ECE):</b> 1,020 children enrolled in non-certified ECE program.</li> <li>• <b>Non-formal education (NFE):</b> 1,975 children accessed NFE, Drop-Out program. A significant increase of 36,799 children was enrolled in learning support services (LSS)/informal education.</li> </ul> </li> <li>➤ <b>Quality:</b> 869 teachers, facilitators and school staff were trained on PSS, child-centered approach and life-skills.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Coordinator to share Jordan NGL report to partners.</li> <li>• Partners to report education updates in Activity-Info on time as per agreed sector timeline</li> <li>• World Child Canada to revise its report in AI.</li> <li>• Partners to submit their funding status through FTS against inter-agency appeal of JRP/3RP 2018.</li> </ul>	<p>Done</p> <p>By 8<sup>th</sup> of each month</p>

<p><b><u>Cross-sector and thematic working groups and task forces updates</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>CP-Education Working Group:</b> A joint meeting between Child Protection and Education Working Group would organize to discuss about violence against children in schools.</li> <li>• <b>Disability Task Force (DTF):</b> The age and disability TF were working together to document the best practices. In the last meeting there was a presentation from different organizations. A two-pager best practice will be documented and shared by members of DTF.</li> <li>• <b>Gender Focal Point: Start</b> revising gender analysis report and meet with sector chair to discuss way forward. The Group is working to enhance the visibility through improve community communication of visibility materials.</li> </ul>	<p>Partners to attend the joint meeting to contribute to agree joint response to combat violence against children.</p> <p>DTF to share the best practices to partners when they are made available.</p>	<p>17 April 2018</p>
<p><b><u>Urban and camp coordination:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Supervisory Unit was established to improve quality of education and combat violence in camp schools. Currently supervisors of the unit are providing daily training and mentoring to camp teachers and principals in three camps (Azraq, Zaatari and EJC).</li> <li>• Out-of-school Task Force comprising Education, Protection and Community Service working groups agreed to work together to address the issue of out-of-school children in Azraq camp.</li> <li>• ECD center of Relief International will be opening ceremony in the presence of MOE, and WC-UK will start to provide KG services in D8 in Zaatari.</li> <li>• UNHCR reported that 52 Syrian university students will be graduated this years from Jordanian universities.</li> <li>• A new school for KG-Grade 4 was operational in Azraq camp to address overcrowding in village 2.</li> </ul>	<p>A joint meeting between Education, Protection and Community Service Working Groups to be held in Azraq to agree on action plan for improving universal enrolment in Azraq camp.</p>	<p>17 April 2018</p>
