 JRP 3 pillars updates: Access, Quality and Systems Strengthening: Access: As of May, cumulatively partners have provided access to 2,642 children with non-certified ECE program, 2,210 with certified Non-formal education (NFE) and 66,523 children with learning support services. Quality: 869 teachers, facilitators and school staff were trained on PSS and child-centered approach and life-skills.  CP-Education Working Group: The first group meeting will be after Eid to review a list of recommendations for addressing violence in schools. Five members from ESWG will participate. SGBV: The national SGBV SWG will organize a one-day training of trainers on SGBV safe referrals. The ToT will equip participants with skills to train non specialized frontline staff (non SGBV staff) on conducting safe referrals for SGBV survivors (mainly referrals to SGBV case management services). Two ESWG members will be selected to attend the training and will then offer training to other ESWG members. Youth: IRD & UNFPA training youth center was launched on July 1st in district 10; an international bridging education and art organization looking for partners within the Za'tari camp to provide hip-hop training, will begin in September and require logistical support. Disability Task Force (DTF): Developing a set of good practices from different sectors. Some organizations do not know what disability inclusion procedures are. Gender Focal Point: In the process of approving the methodology and outline of gender analysis from previous years and will produce a revised version before July so that the final analysis can feed into the JRP process. The final analysis will be made available on the UNHCR Web portal. ITS task force update: During their monthly meeting a key issue was discussed; the amnesty program continues.  mapping is in progress; SOPs were shared with the members. There is a need for a needs assessment to be conducted. Cash for Education: Hajati cash assistance covers 55,000 children. 12% Jordania; 85% Syrian; 3% other nationalities. Coverage is for 20,000 households. The amount per child is JD 20. Expecting the post distribution monitoring results to be issued the next month. High impact evaluation for the next school year 2019 conducted by UNICEF in Italy. Budget constraints will impact the number of beneficiaries the program can serve, but the number has not been determined. The change will begin in September and will be communicated in July. There is discussion about how to cover the loss in funding with cash for work consortiums. Awareness raising continues through SMS messaging for beneficiaries not receiving cash to try to minimise the number of drop outs. Minimum Expenditure Basket need to be updated as it directly linked to Hajati need rather than actual assistance provision to the constraints. Early childhood Development TF: There is a new task force but the objectives and structure is unclear.
