Agenda 1 &2: Introductions were successfully done,

The UNHCR Public Health Officer welcomed members for the year's first meeting. He appreciated all partners who continued to offer services throughout the festive season.

He noted that the major reason for the day's engagement is to share priority activities for the Quarter (January to March) and get updates from partners.

<p><u>Improve Medicine management:</u> Noted that partners were not practicing proper medicine management protocols; updating of stock cards, compiling monthly consumption reports, Rational prescriptions</p> <p>Medicine inventory/physical count for IRC & RMF warehouse started; activity was not completed because some warehouses didn't have updated stock cards</p> <p>Prescription analysis for Health Facilities to start; all HFs will be assessed and put on league table on monthly basis. There will be sanctions for poorly performing/non improving facilities</p>	<p>IRC and RMF to finalise updating their stock (on stock cards) IRC & RMF to share monthly consumption reports in one week Activity to resume on 15th January for IRC warehouse</p> <p>Pharmacist and UNHCR PHO to identify indicators and share during the next coordination meeting</p>
<p><u>Referral database:</u> Orientation for data managers on the referral database was done Proper documentation of referrals should start immediately</p>	<p>Partners to provide update on implementation</p>
<p><u>Mapping for children:</u> It was noted that the major challenge affecting immunization campaigns in the settlement is identification of eligible children. Through community workers, all eligible children in the community should be mapped to aid proper planning</p>	<p>UNHCR to share tool for mapping children, Activity to start next week</p>

<p><u>Balanced Scorecard Assessment:</u> One of the activities that was pended last year; Mandatory assessment for all Health facilities in the settlement, A 3 hour orientation for Zonal Medical Officers and provision of tools by UNHCR</p>	<p>Orientation for MOs scheduled for Frid, 19th Jan Assessment to start next week</p>
<p><u>Medical Waste management:</u> A big set back in service delivery, Agreement had been reached last year on fencing of waste management points, identification of facility focal persons and orientation and proper marking of waste generation points</p> <p>Oxfam has organized an orientation for health workers in Yoyo on incinerator use; partners urged to use opportunity to orient their focal persons across different facilities</p>	<p>For partners to provide updates</p> <p>Scheduled for Friday 19th January</p>
<p><u>Viral Hemorrhagic fever in South Sudan:</u> Rift valley fever outbreak in SS could spill over to Uganda due to forth and back movements, especially at the border (Goboro) RMF team at the border was oriented Active and passive surveillance ongoing Emphasis for the team on proper infection control practices HFs in the settlement to conduct CMEs on VHF</p>	<p>The Goboro team should not be rotated as was done previously, Goboro team to share daily reports CME updates</p>
