


As of August 2018, Somalia was host to 31,836 registered refugees and asylum seekers, mainly from Ethiopia and Yemen.

Over 121,000 Somali refugees have voluntarily returned to Somalia since December 2014 from Kenya, Yemen, Djibouti, Libya, Tunisia and Eritrea. Of those, UNHCR has provided assistance to 107,986 persons, while 13,123 returnees from Yemen returned without the assistance of UNHCR.





of refugees and asylum-seekers




2.6 MILLION
INTERNALLY DISPLACED IN SOMALIA



As of end August 2018, there were estimated to be 2.6 million internally displaced persons in Somalia. Some 53,000 people were newly displaced in August 2018, over half of whom came to Banadir from Lower Shabelle due to conflict. In 2018 so far, 695,000 have been internally displaced due to conflicts, floods and drought.



