




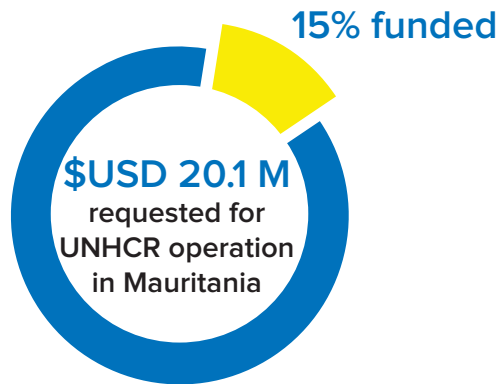

-  **100** Refugees attending university with scholarships and enrolled in training programmes
