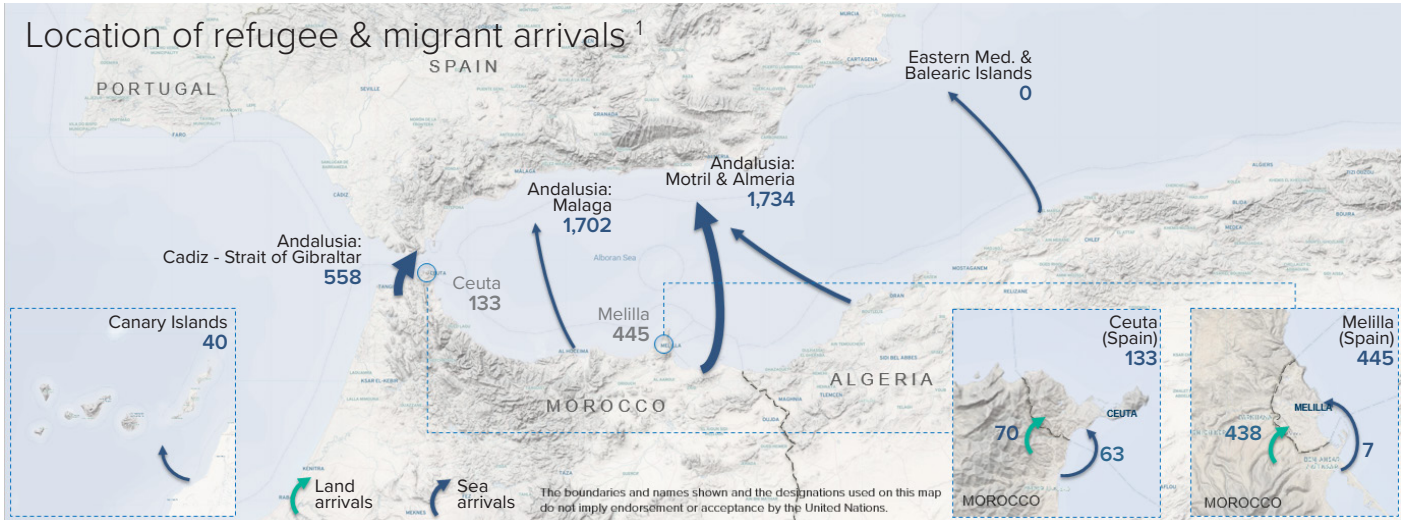

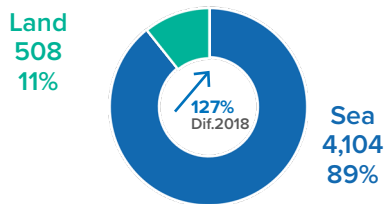

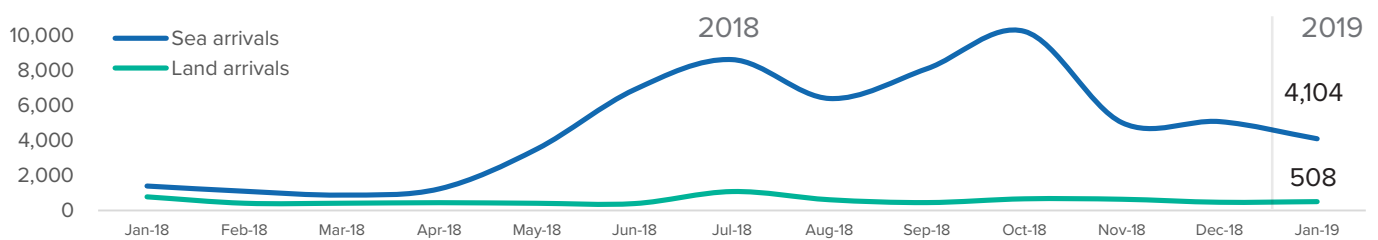

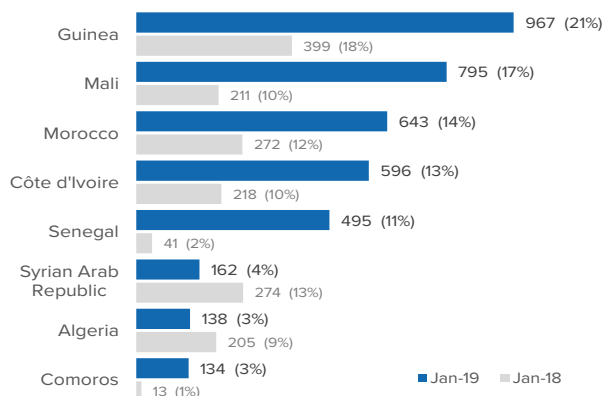

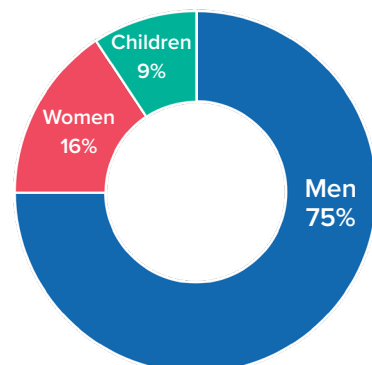
Arrivals trend by month

Demography of arrivals, Jan 2019



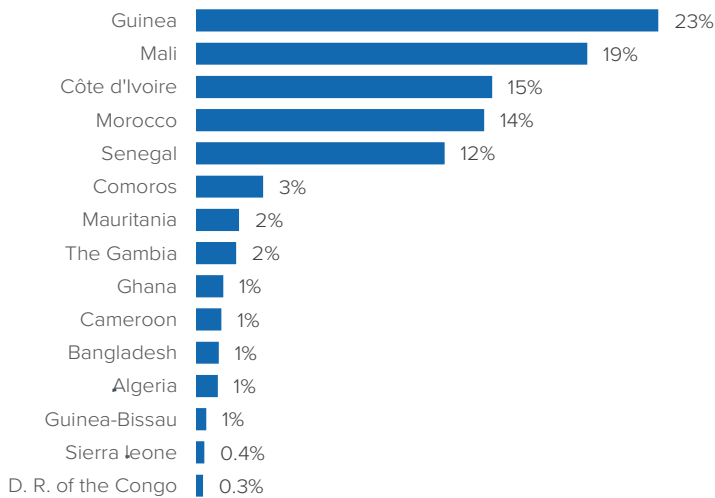

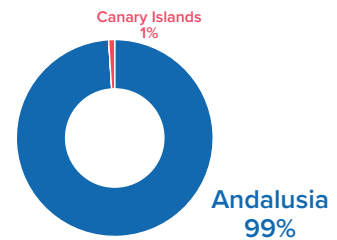

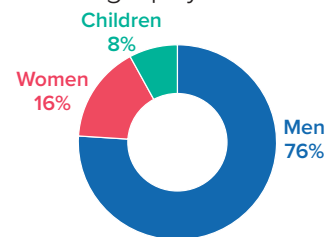

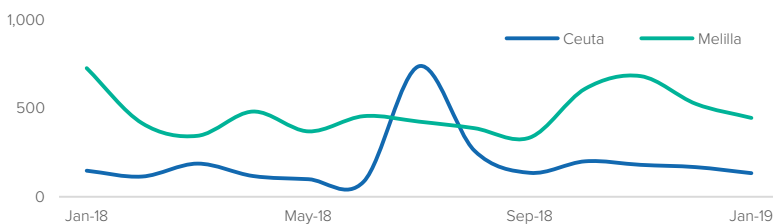

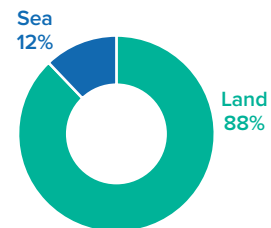

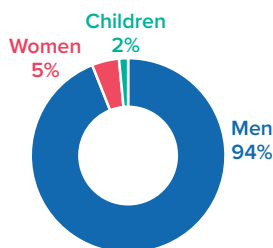

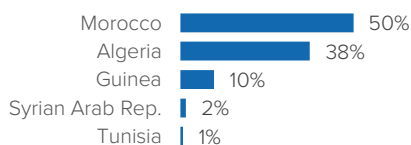

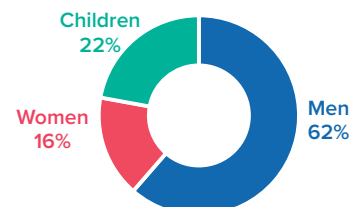

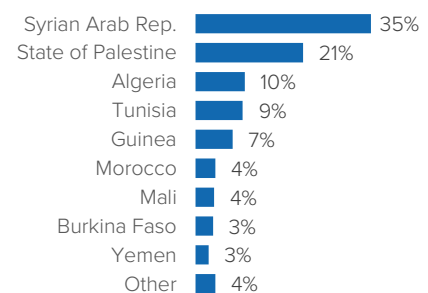
