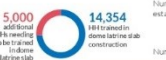

RRP performance tracking through ActivityInfo – What?

- Online platform for indicator and activity reporting that replaces Excel-based 5Ws.
- Allows for analysis of achievements and gaps at national, district and settlement level.
- Central repository of indicator data for all sectors disaggregated by beneficiary type
- Activity data disaggregated by implementation type, funding and modality

RRP performance tracking through ActivityInfo – Why?

- There is a need for more predictable and comprehensive information on key indicators of the refugee response.
- This includes achievements for strategic level reporting as well as gap analysis for operational decision-making and advocacy.
- Current Excel-based templates are labour intensive to process, error prone and do not offer comprehensive data across sectors.

RRP performance tracking through ActivityInfo – Where?

- Partner reporting focal points are requested to report on their activities across the country
- Reporting can be done by settlement or other locations as needed (reception centres, transit centres, schools, districts, sub-counties, neighbourhoods etc.)

- A task force has been created to:
 - Agree on information products
 - Draft standard procedure for reporting
 - Review indicators / activities with sector leads
 - Configure online platform and train stakeholders
