General update

CCCM partners in distributed site maintenance tools in Nasa Hablod A and B in Hargeisa. They further visited IDP sites to map existing governance structures and humanitarian partner activities in the sites.

Construction of community centres, two in Garowe and three in Burtnile is ongoing to be completed by the end of March 2019. CCCM partner distributed additional site maintenance tools to the site committees.

CCCM partner conducted training on CCCM for 20 government officials from North and South Galkayo. In addition, 21 humanitarian staff from North and South Mudug were trained on CCCM on ways to improve coordination of the integrated multi-sectorial response at site level and to raise the quality of interventions and monitoring of humanitarian services in communal settings.


In Baidoa, the CCCM partner conducted one day workshop on camp governance for 50 community leaders (27 female and 23 male) from 6 IDP sites.

CCCM Partner provided cash for work for site maintenance activities in Banadir. 210 workers will benefit for the next three months. The beneficiaries were trained on site improvement activities. Site maintenance tools were distributed in 25 IDP camps.

CCCM teams in Doolow conducted community awareness campaigns in two IDP camps, Kabasa and Qansaxlay, on complaints and feedback process. IDPs were advised on where to report humanitarian issues and the kind of issues to report.
