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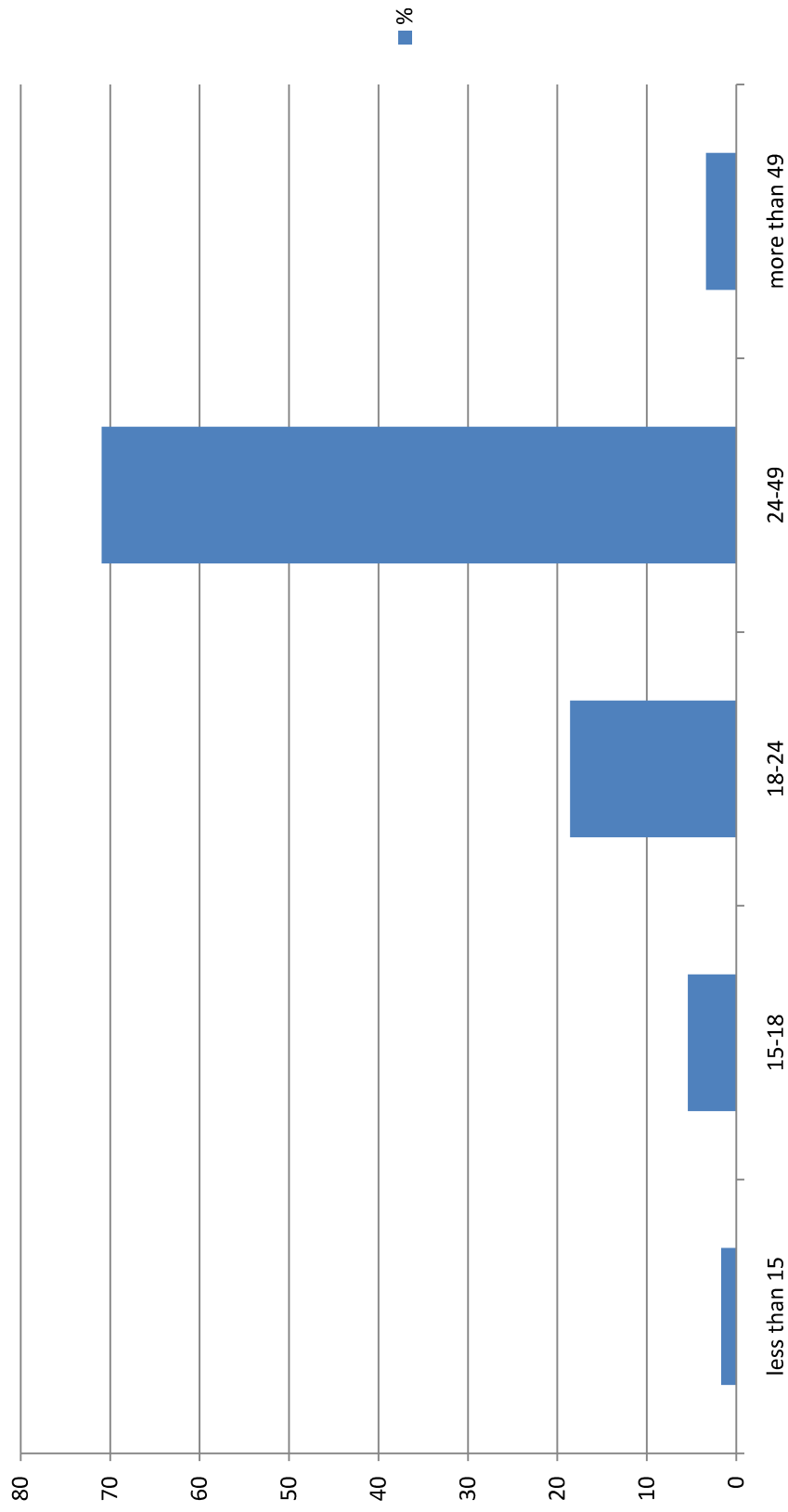


Reproductive Health Needs Zatari Camp

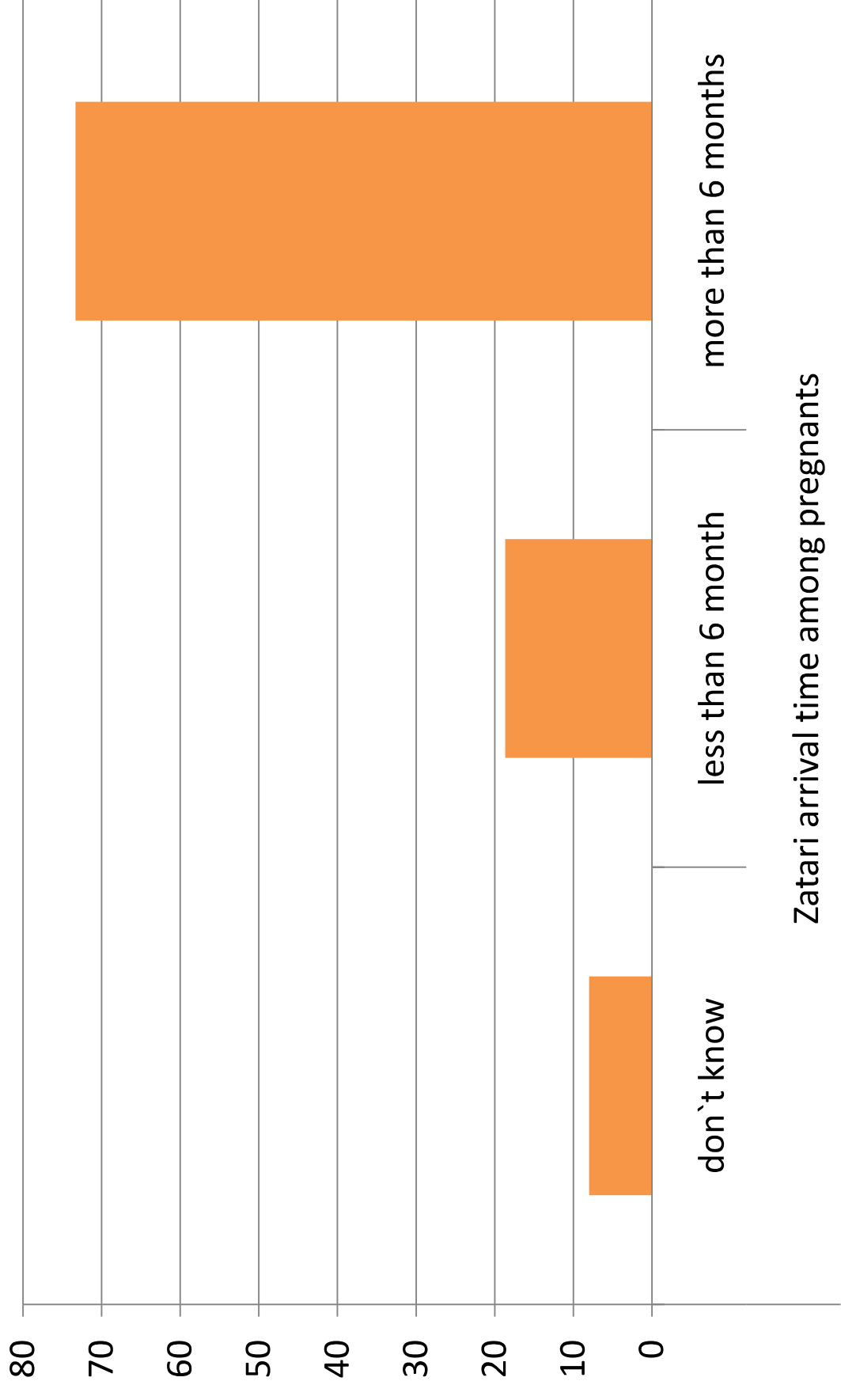
Methodology

Cross sectional survey conducted by UNFPA using interagency reproductive health needs assessment questionnaire, after a training, the community health volunteers distributed survey to 300 women of reproductive age living in Za'tari camp during May 2014, data analyzed through SPSS (16) software.

Age categories for the women under study



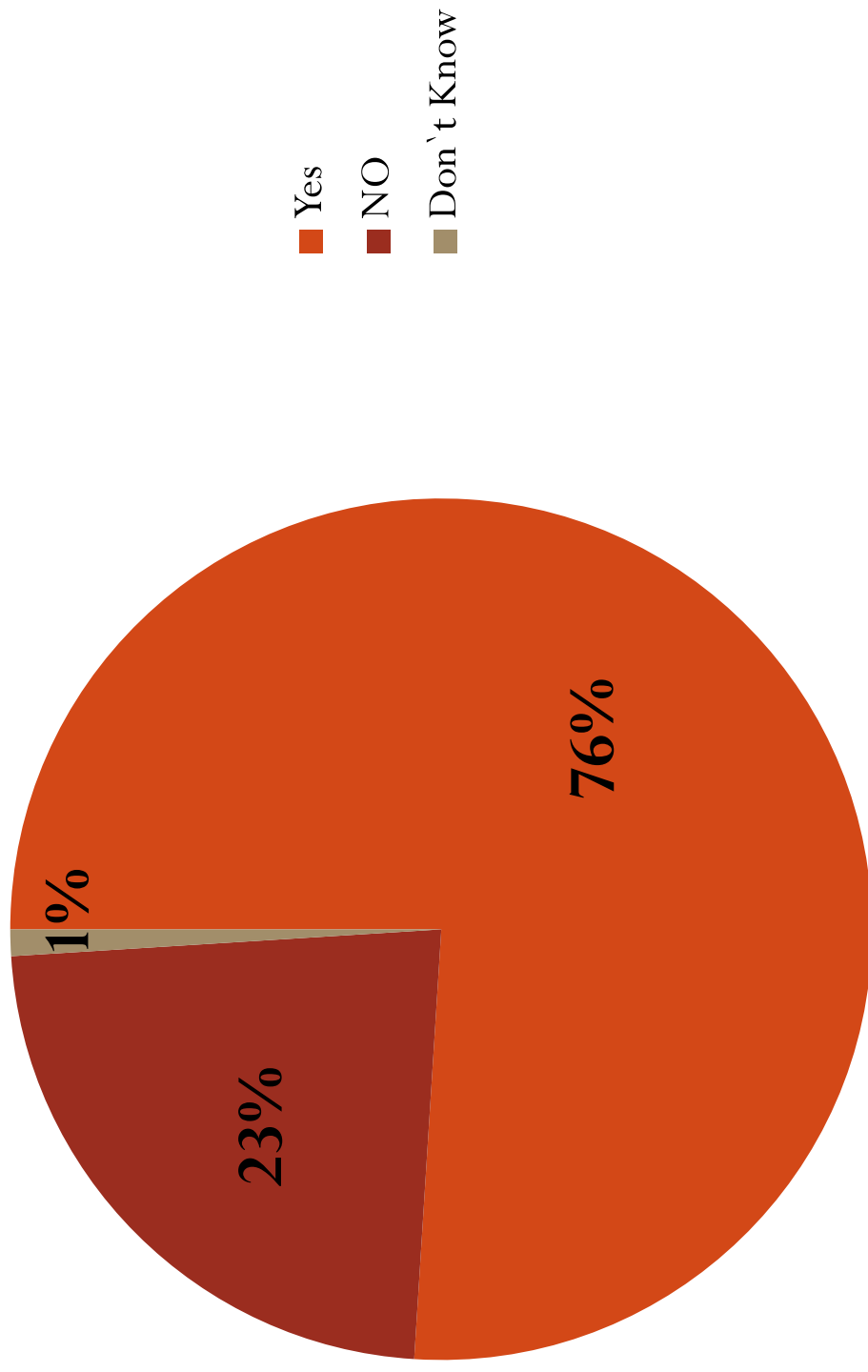
Arrival time for pregnant to Za`tari camp



Zatari arrival time among pregnant

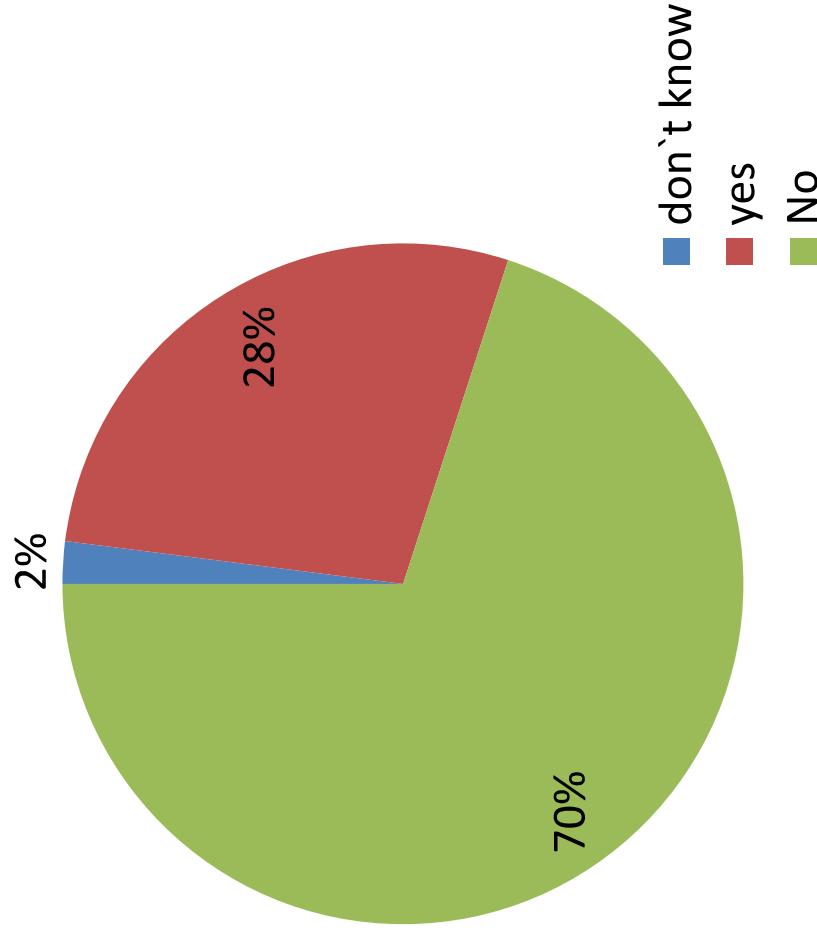

Awareness about Available Reproductive health services



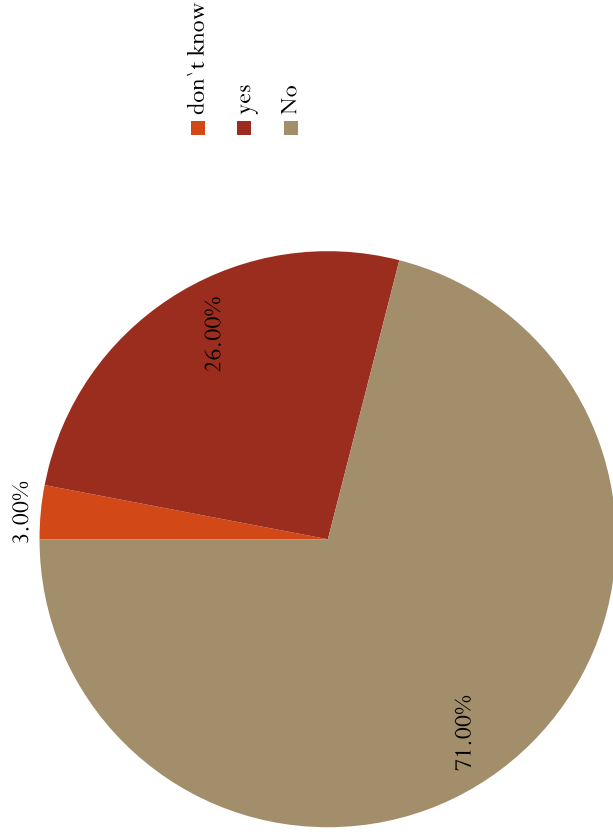
Unintended Pregnancies

The question was “Have you ever gotten pregnant when you did not want to? Pregnancy has risks and potential complication, on average, unintended pregnancies result in poorer outcomes for the mother and for the child



Complications During Deliveries

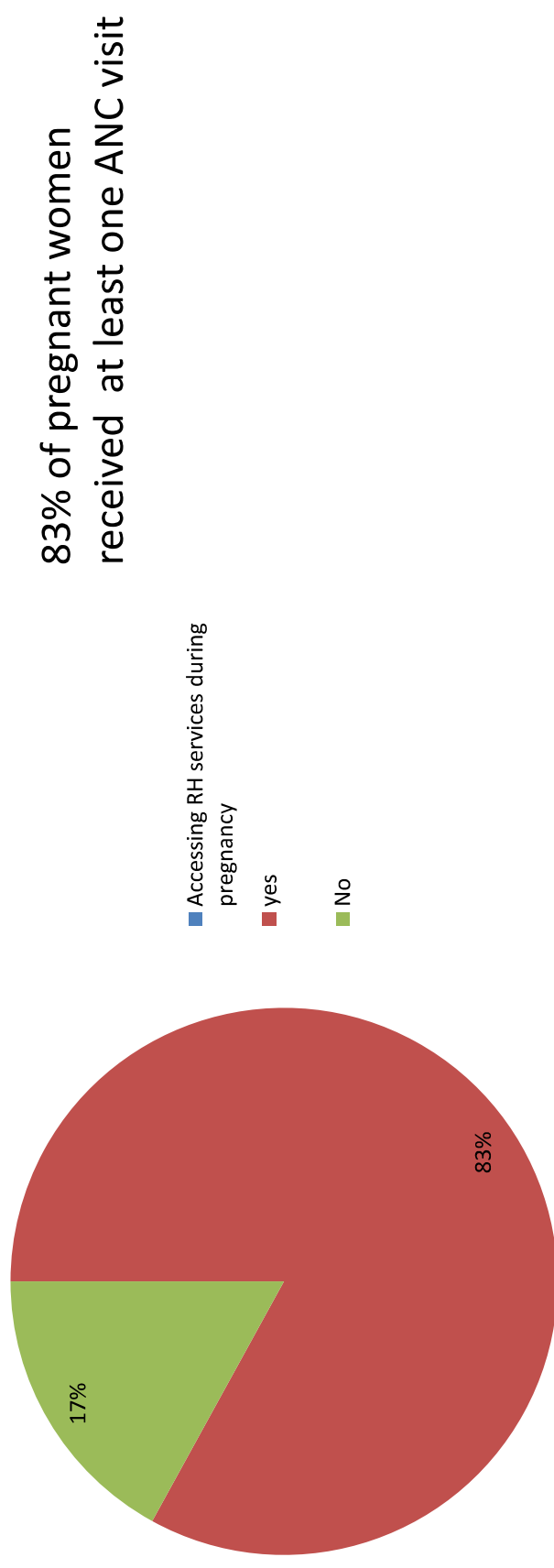
% of major complications during



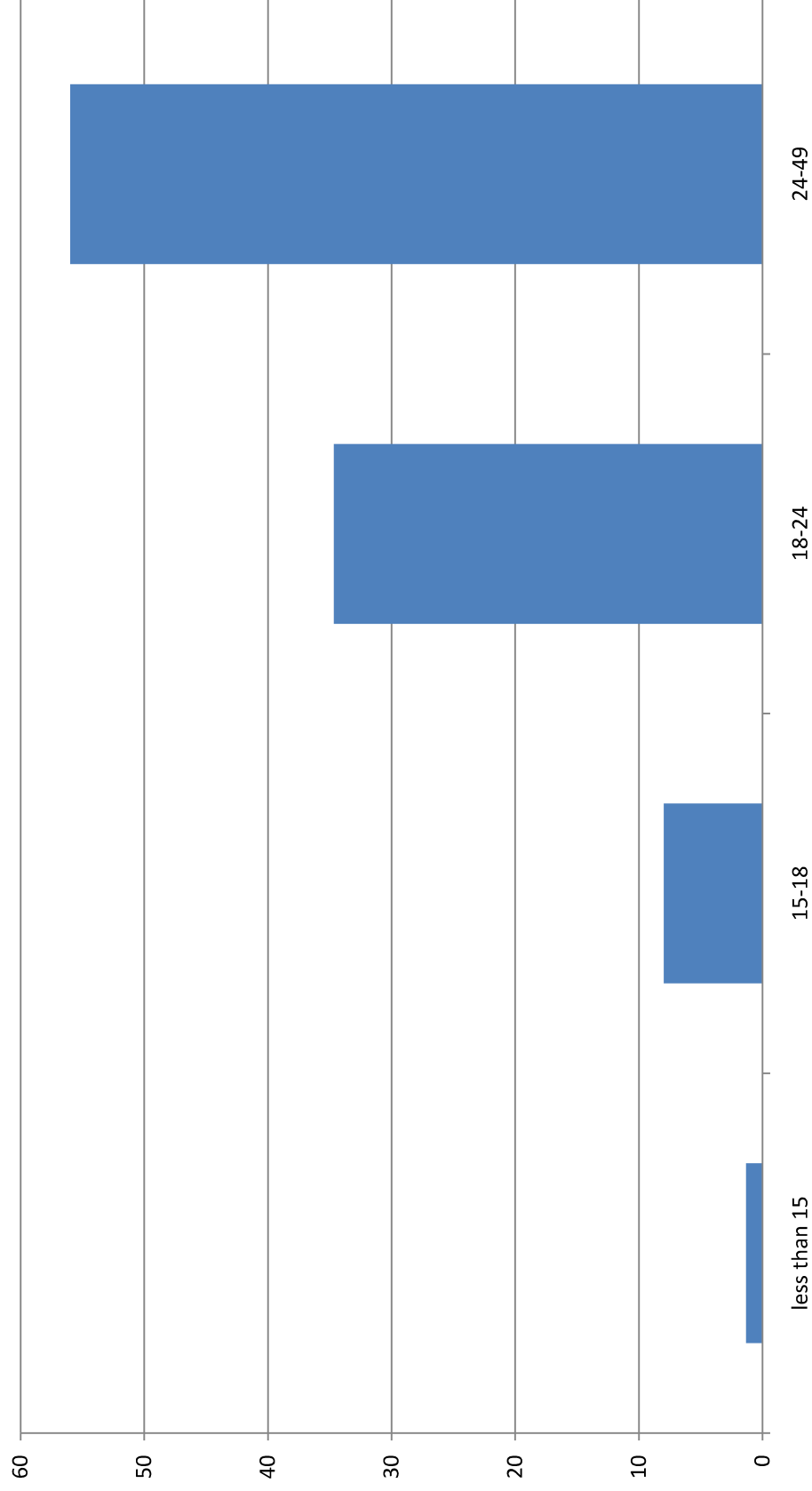
One or more of the below was reported:

1. Heavy bleeding during pregnancy
2. Heavy bleeding right after birth
3. Prolonged (>12 hours) labor, obstructed labor
4. Infection (fever)
5. Convulsions (pre-eclampsia/eclampsia)
6. Incomplete abortion (spontaneous or induced)
7. Other major problem

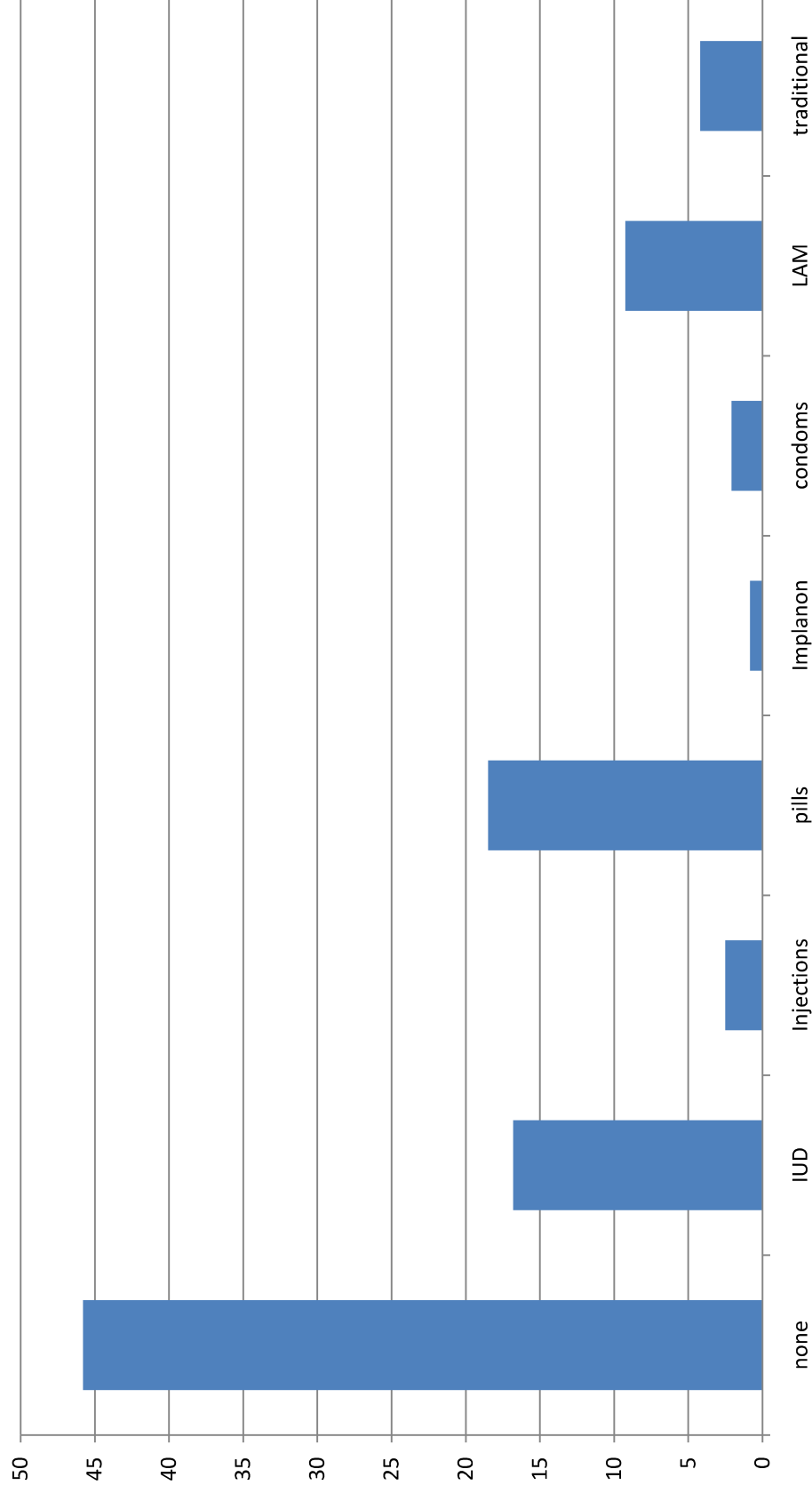
Pregnant who accessed RH services

Recommendations:

Based on study results the following interventions are highly recommended:

- Increasing RH awareness inside Za`tari camp especially at the time of women arrivals to the camps
- Strengthening RH awareness activities inside the camp in collaboration with community and other NGOs
- Strengthening the current RH service providers capacity in technical delivery of services in particular family planning counseling
- Improve youth participation and youth initiatives to improve reproductive health knowledge and practices
- Continue RH campaigns inside the camp
- Support RH clinics to manage advanced complications
- Improve referral between non-RH service providers and RH service providers to reduce missed opportunities
