







The UNHCR-led PRMN implemented in partnership with NRC reported 61,000 new internal displacements in the month of December 2019. Of these, 46,000 were triggered by flood, 7,000 by conflict /insecurity and 6,000 were drought related.





BY REGION (Jan - Dec 2019)








In Lower Shabelle region 3,000 persons were reported as newly displaced as a result of military operations against armed militia groups.



BY REGION (Jan - Dec 2019) DEP ARR











During the month of December, Sanaag (2,000) and Bari (1,000) regions were the most affected by new displacements where the main reason given was drought or related lack of livelihoods.



The PRMN (Protection & Return Monitoring Network) is a UNHCR-led project which identifies and reports on displacements (including returns) of populations in Somalia. The network also identifies and reports on protection risks and incidents underlying such movements. Only figures collected by PRMN are reported above. Not all displacements in Somalia are captured. This dashboard should be read in conjunction with the Notes on PRMN Methodology (https://data2.unhcr.org/en/documents/details/53888) which outline the approach and certain limitations. The figures shown are for numbers of individuals and are based on interviews with key informants and/or displaced hoseholds at destination (unless otherwise noted).
