





Main Achievements

From 1 January to 31 March 2020, *16 cases of 74 individuals* (of Nigerian nationality) were submitted under normal priority to two (2) Resettlement countries including France and Canada. The cases were submitted under Normal priority and the Criteria of Survivor of Violence and/or Torture (13 cases of 59 individuals) and Lack of Foreseeable Alternative Durable Solutions (3 cases of 15 individuals). The submissions included 32 males (17 of whom aged 0 to 17 and 15 aged 18 to 59) and 42 females (27 of whom aged 0 to 17 and 15 aged 18 to 59). Also, during the reporting period, a total number of 10 individuals (of Nigerian nationality) departed to one (1) Resettlement country (Canada).

As of 31 March 2020, 37% of the attributed quota of 200 individuals (to be submitted from Diffa) has been achieved.

CONSTRAINTS



Due to the **COVID-19 pandemic**, Resettlement country missions and departures to Resettlement countries were cancelled. **32 cases of 127 individuals** were scheduled for interview by France (from 30 March to 3 April) and 8 cases of 29 individuals for departures to Canada (from 31 March to 15 April). Furthermore, by mid-March, new Resettlement interviews were suspended.

Other achievements (following restriction measures due to the COVID-19 pandemic)

After departures, country missions and new interviews were put on hold, the Resettlement Unit was able to:

- Complete Resettlement interviews for 3 cases of 8 individuals;
- Provide counselling and follow-up for 40 cases of 156 individuals which were scheduled for participation to Resettlement Country Missions or departure to Resettlement Countries (32 cases of 127 individuals for interview by France and 8 cases of 29 individuals for departure to Canada);
- Provide clarifications for 2 cases of 14 individuals which were submitted to Canada;
- Complete RRF drafting for 3 cases of 13 individuals which were referred for revision and submission;
- Revise profiling forms for 9 identified cases of 36 individuals which were cleared for Protection/Durable Solutions Panel;
- Identify, through proGres, 8 potential Resettlement cases of 32 individuals which were cleared for profiling interview.
