


#### **VERIFIED IDP SITES IN KISMAYO AS OF OCTOBER 2020**




#### **Assessment overview**

A joint IDP site verification exercise was conducted in Kismayo town in September 2020. The operation was led by CCCM partners and JRIA. 144 IDP sites were identified hosting 12,010 households or 64,051 individuals. Compared to the last site verification conducted in August 2019, there was an increae of 5 IDP sites and 1,223 Households or 4,840 individuals.

## People living with disability

## **Eviction Risk Mapping**

IDP sites were assessed based on their risk of eviction. Several factors were put into consideration such as IDP site tenure, type of agreements in place and whether an eviction notice has been

35% of IDP sites have been classified

82% of sites are landowner authorized occupancy

52% of sites have no agreement in place

58% of those that have agreements have oral agreements

55% of those that have agreements have no agreed end dates

22% of sites have been issued with eviction notice within the last 3 months

IDP sites were assessed based on their risk of flooding.


