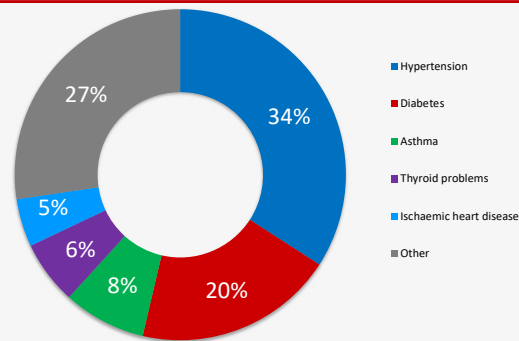

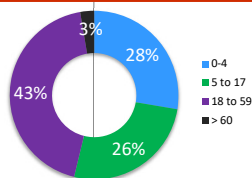

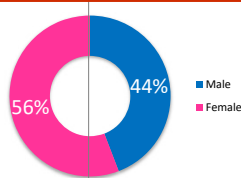

by age

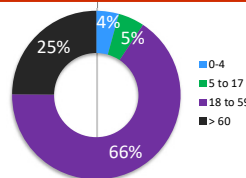

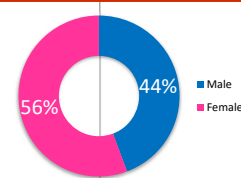


Breakdown of chronic health conditions

by age



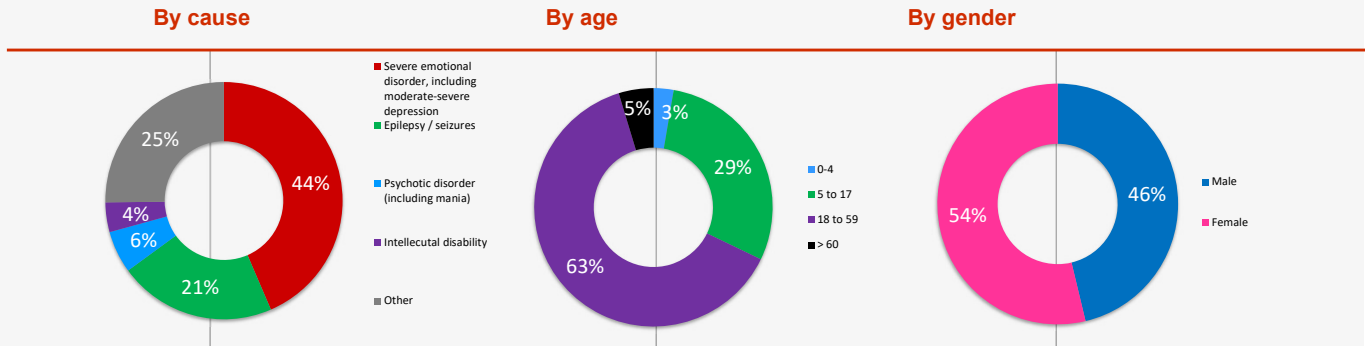

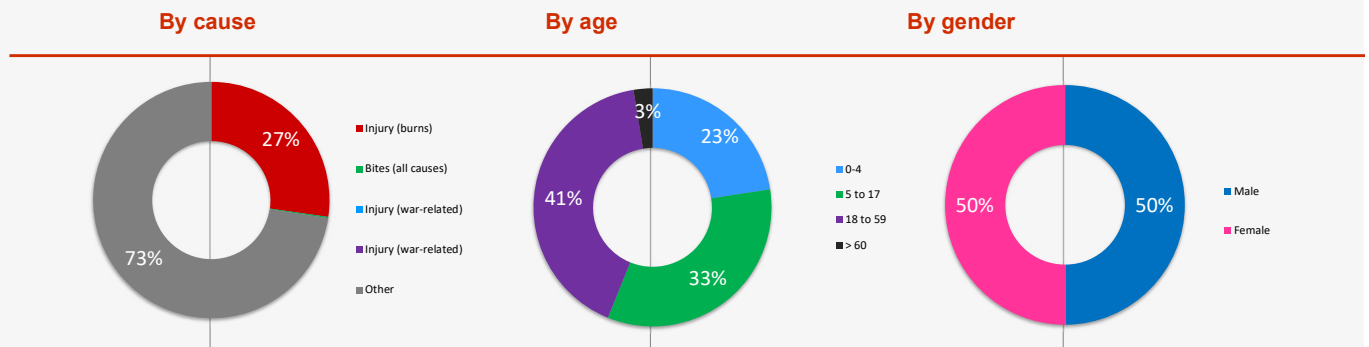
