


VERIFIED IDP SITES IN GAALKAYO AS OF MARCH 2021




Assessment overview

A joint IDP site verification exercise was conducted in North and South Gaalkayo in March 2021. The operation was led by DRC, GCRI, GECPD, IRC, KAF, MercyCorps, NoFYL, NRC, PMWDO, SCI, SOSDA, SVDG, WISE and UNHCR. 90 IDP sites were identified hosting 21,688 households or 125,600 individuals. Compared to the last site verification conducted in December 2019, there was a increase of 12 IDP sites and 2,250 Households or 7,330 individuals.

People living with disability

Using the washington group disability questions, statistics of people living with disabilities were derived

10,081 (8%) people living with disability

2,468 (58% Female) have difficulty with seeing (even wearing glasses)

1,455 (58% Female) have difficulty with hearing (even using a hearing aid)

1,440 (62% Female) have difficulty with communicating and/or understanding

*** 2,087 (60% Female) have difficulty with walking and/or climbing stairs

1,239 (54% Female) have difficulty with dressing and/or washing

1,392 (57% Female) have difficulty with remembering/concentrating

Eviction Risk Mapping

IDP sites were assessed based on their risk of eviction. Several factors were put into consideration such as IDP site tenure, type of agreements in place and whether an eviction notice has been issued recently.

17% of IDP sites have been classified as having extreme (7%) and high (10%) risk of eviction

149% of sites have communal ownership/permanent ownership

80% of sites have agreement in place

75% of those that have agreements have written agreements


100% of those that have agreements have agreed end dates

41% of sites have been issued with eviction notice within the last 3 months

Flood Risk Mapping

IDP sites were assessed based on their risk of flooding.

17 IDP sites (19%) have been classified as extreme (always floods) and high (floods frequently)
