








OVERVIEW

DRIVE is the Documentation Renewal and Information Verification Exercise undertaken by the Government of Pakistan – The Ministry of States and Frontier Regions (SAFRON), the Chief Commissionerate for Afghan Refugees (CCAR) and the National Database and Registration Authority (NADRA) - and supported by UNHCR.

DRIVE will verify and update the data of **1.43 million Afghan refugees** who are Proof of Registration (PoR) cardholders in Pakistan, and will issue new smart, biometric PoR cards for all eligible refugees. The new smart cards will be updated with a validity period of two-years.

DRIVE verifications will be carried out at a total of **40 sites** across Pakistan, supported by six mobile teams. When operating at full capacity, a targeted average of **10,400 individuals** per day will be verified, six days a week. Over **300 staff** from NADRA, CCAR and UNHCR will be engaged in the exercise to support with admission and intake, data validation and review, document issuance and identification of protection needs.

PROGRESS

Since the launch of DRIVE on 15 April 2021, 35 sites across Pakistan have been activated. During the month of Ramadan as well as to mitigate COVID-19, all DRIVE sites in Pakistan were operating at reduced working hours (09.00 to 14.00) and only processing up to 40% of their maximum processing capacity. A daily average of 3,800 individuals to be processed per day was targeted during this period.

In its first weeks, DRIVE performance has built toward the 40% processing cap imposed to manage COVID risks. At the end of this initial period, COVID SOP compliance had reached 95%. **Daily site cleaning** increased from 65% to 95% and the presence of security personnel increased from 54% to 95%. Initial software and network issues faced with regard to the new DRIVE application and new scheduling application have been substantially resolved by the NADRA technical team.

DRIVE site processes have continued to be refined in the first three weeks of its operation, including improvements and fixes in the scheduling application.



Since the launch, three sites have been temporarily suspended in line with Government movement restriction orders responding to COVID. All of these have subsequently been re-activated. Efforts to improve information provisions to refugees, to ensure the presence of both security guards and data operators; and strengthen the identification of persons with protection needs on site, are ongoing.


KEV FIGURES

As of 28 May 2021, a cumulative total of 72,725 individuals have been processed across Pakistan. 49,787 are registered Afghan refugees who have been verified and will receive a new smart PoR card, 6,839 are registered children above five years old who are now eligible for their own individual smart PoR card, while 6,665 are children of PoR cardholders who are under the age of five and will be newly registered following document validation. An additional 4,084 individuals are undocumented immediate family members of Afghan refugees whose information has been recorded to highlight family links with registered Afghan refugees in Pakistan, and will be issued family certificates only.

The majority of verifications to date have been conducted by the 18 sites active in Khyber Pakthunkwa province (55%), with a further 22% in Balochistan province. The current DRIVE exercise also identifies nuclear families from within extended family groupings, averaging five individuals per nuclear family.



AGE AND GENDER COMPOSITION


