

PAKISTAN PRE-SCREENING OVERVIEW

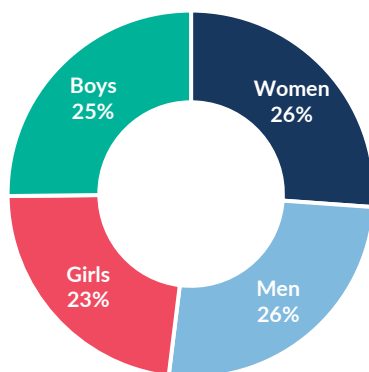

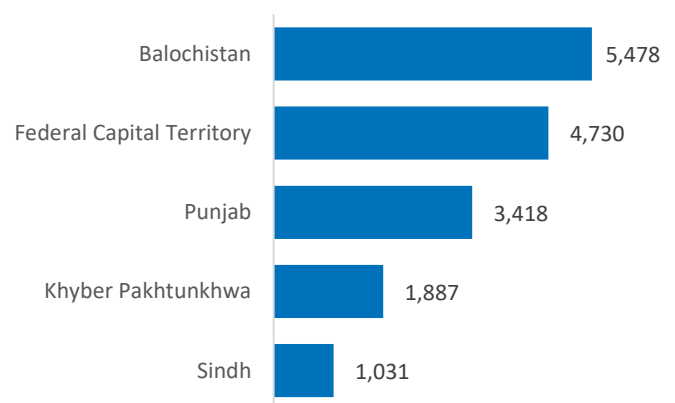
UNHCR Pakistan conducts registration activities within its mandate. In line with the registration strategy, the first step of the procedure envisages pre-screening of the applicants to ascertain their eligibility for registration. Once eligibility is established, the office prioritises registration of individuals based on their protection profiles including those with sensitive refugee claims, minorities, children-at-risk, older persons-at-risk, single parents, persons with disabilities, GBV survivors, women-at-risk and those with specific and legal protection needs. Documentation is issued once the registration process is completed. This dashboard provides an overview of the asylum applications from the Afghan nationals, based on the pre-screening data recorded between 1 April and 8 October.

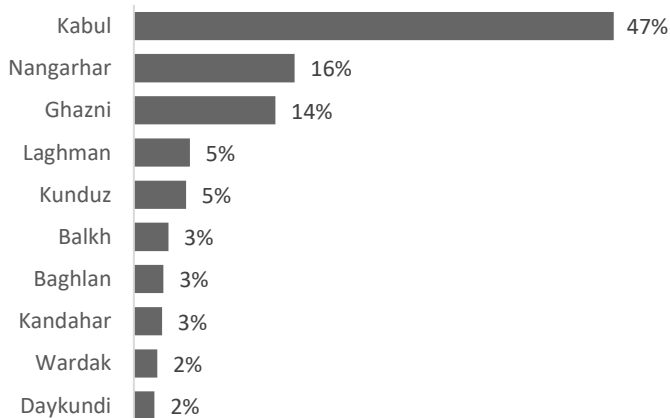
AGE AND GENDER COMPOSITION



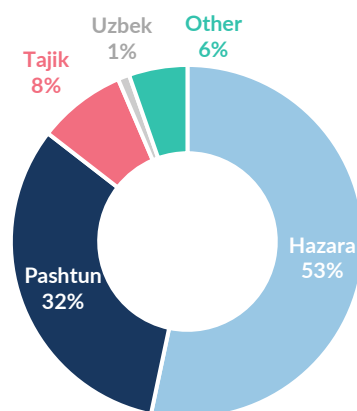
CURRENT PLACE OF RESIDENCE



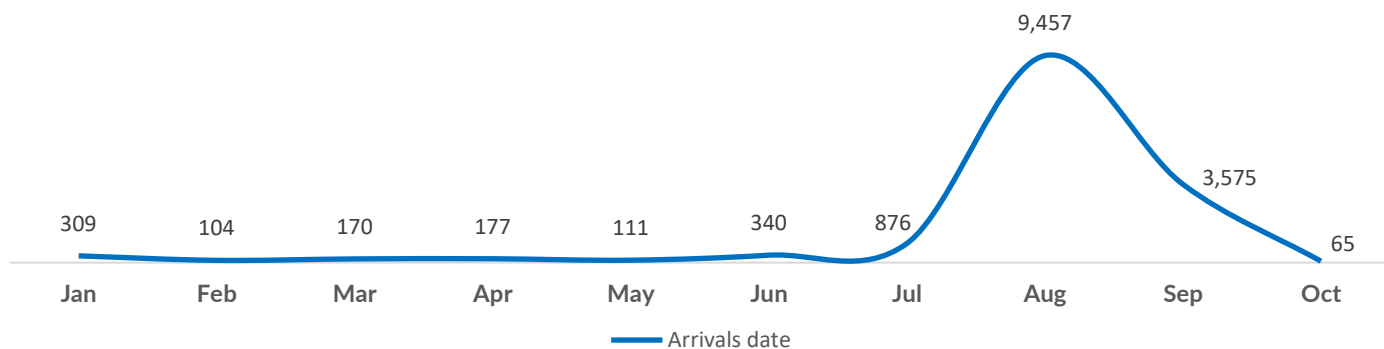
PLACE OF ORIGIN IN AFGHANISTAN (Top 10 Locations)



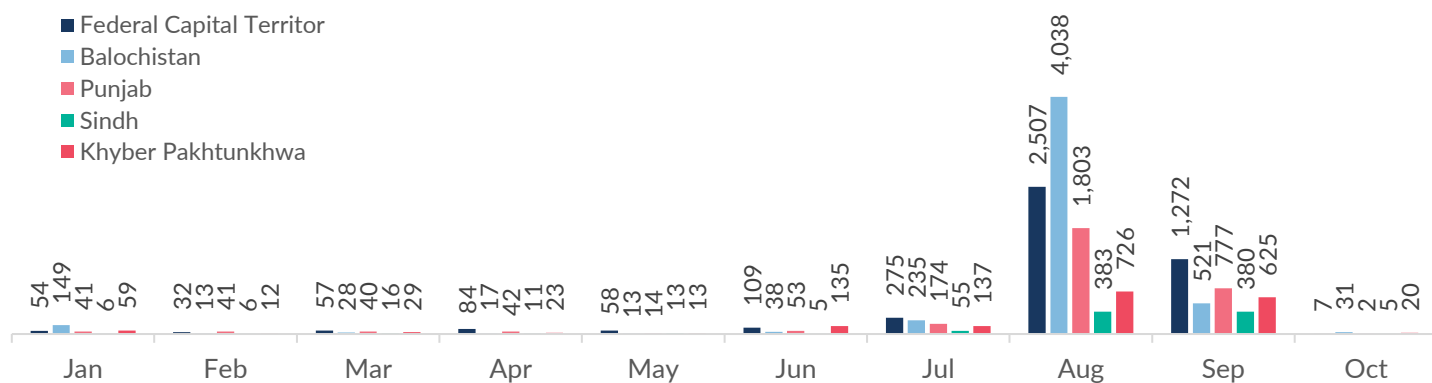

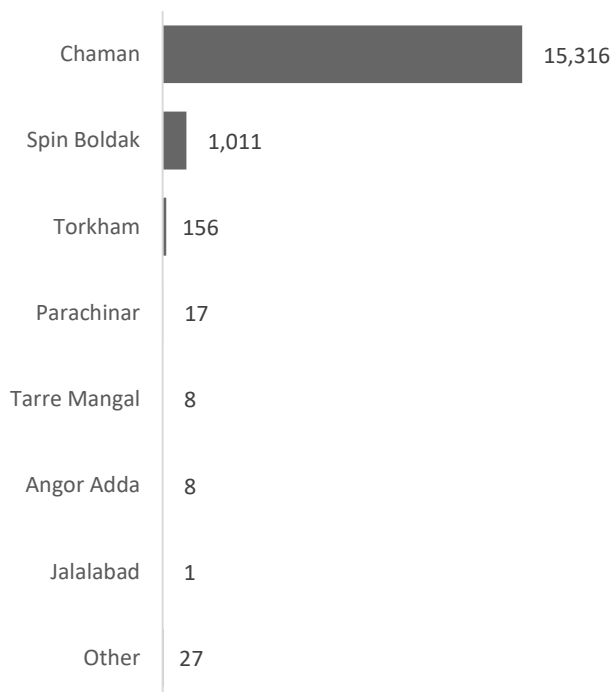
PRE- SCREENING MONTHLY ARRIVALS TREND



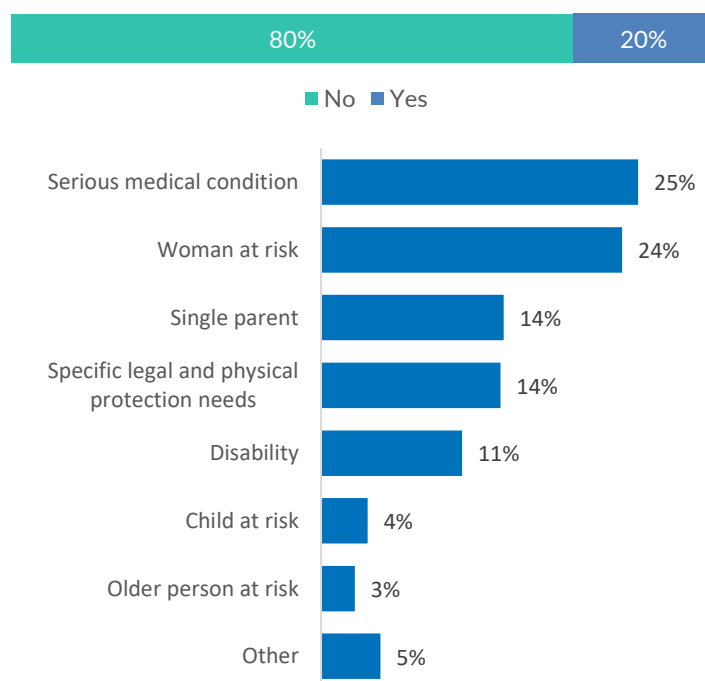
PRE- REGISTRATION TREND BY LOCATION AND ARRIVAL DATE

The chart above indicates the arrival dates since 1 January 2021 of Afghans pre-screened by UNHCR. The figures are subject to change each week as Afghans pre-screened by UNHCR may have arrived earlier in the year. 95% of Afghans pre-screened by UNHCR so far are Afghans who newly arrived in Pakistan (after 1 January 2021), *Each household may include persons with one or more specific needs. The percentage therefore represents households with at least one individual within the household with the specific need. The same household may be represented in multiple specific needs categories.
