Thailand NFI dashboard

Overview

The continuing unrest in Myanmar may result in more individuals escaping persecution and generalized violence, many of whom may cross the border into Thailand to request international protection and assistance from NFI partners. The NFI Sector, comprising of ACTED, COERR, IRC and led by UNHCR are currently continuing with sourcing of funds to preposition NFIs in various locations in the field offices to try and get ready to respond with relief items as soon as the refugees trickle in. More funds are required to meet the set target of 4000 new arrivals on monthly basis.

Response and Preparedness



Non Food Items (NFI)

1.137 Individuals reached with Inkind NFIs

- 1 NFI guidance note and 1 Post Distribution Monitoring guidance developed
- 1 NFI Distribution and Accountability tool developed

Procured and prepositioned NFI Kits

7,200 Individuals currently targeted for the NFI Kits prepositioned (Including baby and women dignity kits) in preparation for a possible influx

The NFI partners at the national level continue to hold semi-monthly NFI Sector preparedness and coordination activities to discuss and update on NFI needs, existing funding, capacity and logistical gaps gaps, needs and strategies. Fundraising continues to be done and the sector continues to receive regular emergency updates from the field and protection sectors in order to prepare and plan better for the possible response

Challenges

- Limited funding to the sector continues to be a glaring challenge
- Limited NFI stock in the field locations
- Lack of storage space to accommodate the NFIs under procurement
- Limited staffing capacity to distribute should the refugees start flowing in.
