In Rakhine State, 71,600 persons remain displaced as of the 31st of December 2021 in ten townships as a result of clashes between the Arakan Army and the Myanmar Armed Forces. UNHCR, in collaboration with partners and other UN agencies, has responded to the humanitarian needs and extended its assistance to affected communities. Thus far in 2021, UNHCR non-food items and emergency shelter support have been provided to some 62,323 affected persons from 15,434 households. In November and December, 848 households in Kyauktaw, Sittwe and Pauktaw Townships received NFI kits and shelter kits , while 1,285 households in Mrauk-U and Myebon Townships received dignity kits and 3,912 households in Buthidaung Township received core essential household items. In November and December, 90 follow-ups and 29 missions were conducted as appropriate.

Access to some sites remains limited, for UNHCR and partners, particularly in more rural areas, a situation which has been further exacerbated by COVID-19.


