1. Updates from Co-chair	
This position has been vacant since August since the departure of the previous co-chair from DCA. LWF has agreed to support this position to co-chair the AAP task team for a period of six months. Appreciation goes to members for their contributions during the development of the Theory of Change and logframe. Based on the Theory of Change, the draft narrative has been developed and shared with the National Refugee Protection Working Group (NRPWG) to incorporate into the protection strategy for the RRP. 2. Integration of Inter-agency FRRM Inter-agency Coordination Group into AAP Task Team (UNHCR)	
Following a discussion held during the Inter Agency FRRM Coordination Group meeting, it was agreed that the Inter-agency FRRM Coordination Group should be integrated into the AAP Task Team.	
Overview of the FRRM Inter-agency Coordination Group	
In 2018, an FRRM Steering Group was established to oversee the design and development and supporting rollout of the tool. Initially the forum only consisted of about 8 agencies led by UNHCR and OPM, UN agencies, as well as some international and national NGO partners. In 2020, the FRRM Inter-agency Coordination Group was established and all agencies that are using the FRRM as a tool were invited to join. agencies with a total 840 individual focal points are functional and are part of the coordination group. The FRRM helpline is now fully operational across the operation and utilized by agencies. Therefore, from a technical perspective there is no longer a real justification for maintaining a continuation of the group as a standalone entity. Given that the FRRM helpline is one of the tools / feedback and response mechanisms to enhance AAP, it was recommended to integrate the FRRM Inter-agency Coordination Group into the AAP Task Team. An update on FRRM call trends could be included as a standing agenda item every month, to ensure greater visibility, transparency, and usage of FRRM call trends across the response. Areas of discussion What updates would the AAP Task team members like to have related to the FRRM? In terms of frequency, would monthly updates be appropriate? Are there any specific themes that members would be interested to have updates on from the FRRM? Ground Truth Solutions gave a presentation to provide members with an overview of the key AAP indicators that have been finalized and gone through various rounds of feedback and input from different groups including the Refugee Engagement Forum (REF) and the AAP Task Team, and potential next steps to seek input from members. 4. Discussion on draft key messages for community mobilization on COVID-19 vaccines	
Need for community mobilization around vaccines was raised in the recent Inter-Agency Coordination meeting and previous discussions were held in several meetings weeks ago. Key messages on COVID-19 vaccines have been drafted and will be shared for inputs from members. A separate meeting to discuss about the actual mobilization involving various partners and a representative from the Refugee INGO Forum that had expressed interest to be involved will be scheduled.
