



Sexual and Reproductive Health Sub-Sector

OBJECTIVE:

This Gender Monitoring Dashboard is a monitoring tool that provides evidence on to what extent Health Sector benefits equally women, girls, boys, and men [WGBM] refugees under humanitarian programming.

It has been developed based on available data/information shared by partners on ActivityInfo and other useful resources as Regional Indicator report, Gender and Age Maps, ISWG and COVID-19 Refugee Response monthly updates, Sector Work Plan, etc.

Data is analysed using several M&E tools: GAM, Availability, Accessibility, Acceptability, and Quality, the Age, Gender and Diversity (AGDs) reflecting differences that may exist between the sexes, clarifications, and thus formulate appropriate recommendations.

With the dashboard information and recommendations, we can refine gender lenses with sector annual planning reflected into the work plan for 2022.

1. Situation of the Sector on Gender:

The SRH concerns with all individuals (Women, Girls, Boys and Men [WGBM]) throughout all life stages and concentrates on implementing the integrated, comprehensive SRH package that crosscuts with three important principles, which is equity in access, quality of care, and accountability, as these principles are fundamentally a matter of respecting protecting and realizing the human rights, including the health right to be appropriate and responsive to gender and life cycle requirements. Therefore, gender equality and the empowerment of girls and women will not be possible without realizing sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR).

1st Indicator: number of SGBV survivors who access medical care.

2nd indicator: number of provided antenatal care visits.

3rd indicator: number of beneficiaries received FP methods.

5,401 beneficiaries (women + girls).

4th indicator: number of under 5 children and WCBA identified and treated for Anemia.

5th indicator: number of beneficiaries reached with health awareness services.

- Strengthening the capacity of 21 health care providers through conducting 2 CMR (clinical management of rape) trainings, including two men health care providers and the rest are ' 19 women health care providers.
- Awareness for WGBM from different age groups.
- Antenatal (ANC), postnatal care (PNC), and family planning (FP) for women of reproductive age (15 – 49 years).
- Providing couple counselling for both men and women.
- Improving the realization of SRHR awareness and the quality of SRH services, including ensuring that rights holders' views and demands are captured and taken into account in the provision of SRHR services to enable them to decide the number of children they want and the spacing between births.
- Ensuring that SRHR are a reality for all by engaging women, men girls, and boys.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - I recommend disaggregating all indicators (e.g., by gender, age .etc.) in the future to be analyzed to ensure the good utilization of the submitted data and check on the progress as well, especially that most indicators such as awareness sessions are provided to WGBM, in addition, that family planning methods are provided to men in some cases, as taking the decision of the family planning requires both partners. However, under beneficiaries served with family planning indicator, the figure is not disaggregated by gender. - Few figures reported on SGBV survivors accessing medical care, which is likely due to reporting issues. - Two indicators are related only to women (antenatal and delivery indicators). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Most of the mentioned indicators above are filled as a total number without disaggregation. This means that most of the ' ' indicators details are not available regarding category; only two indicators are disaggregated by age group. - Ensure the engagement of men and boys as partners in gender transformative change by ensuring that sexual and reproductive health and rights are for all. - I recommend disaggregating all indicators in the Activity -info in the future to be well analyzed.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Under all figures and indicators, it is important to segregate each one per sex and age to ensure the provision of equal services, except for the ANC and delivery indicators. - The plan is to inform SRH SWG members in charge of reporting upon these indicators to report disaggregated data quarterly to share reporting on the implemented activities, including service utilization. 	
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
