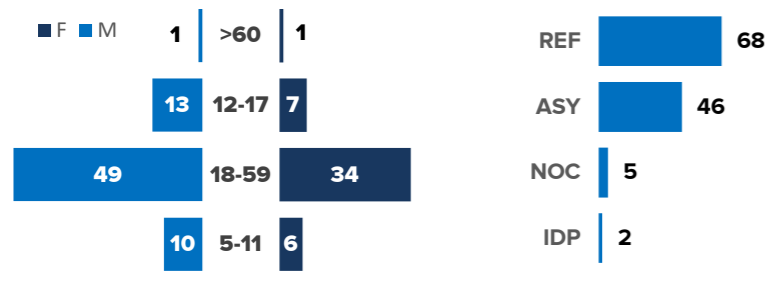


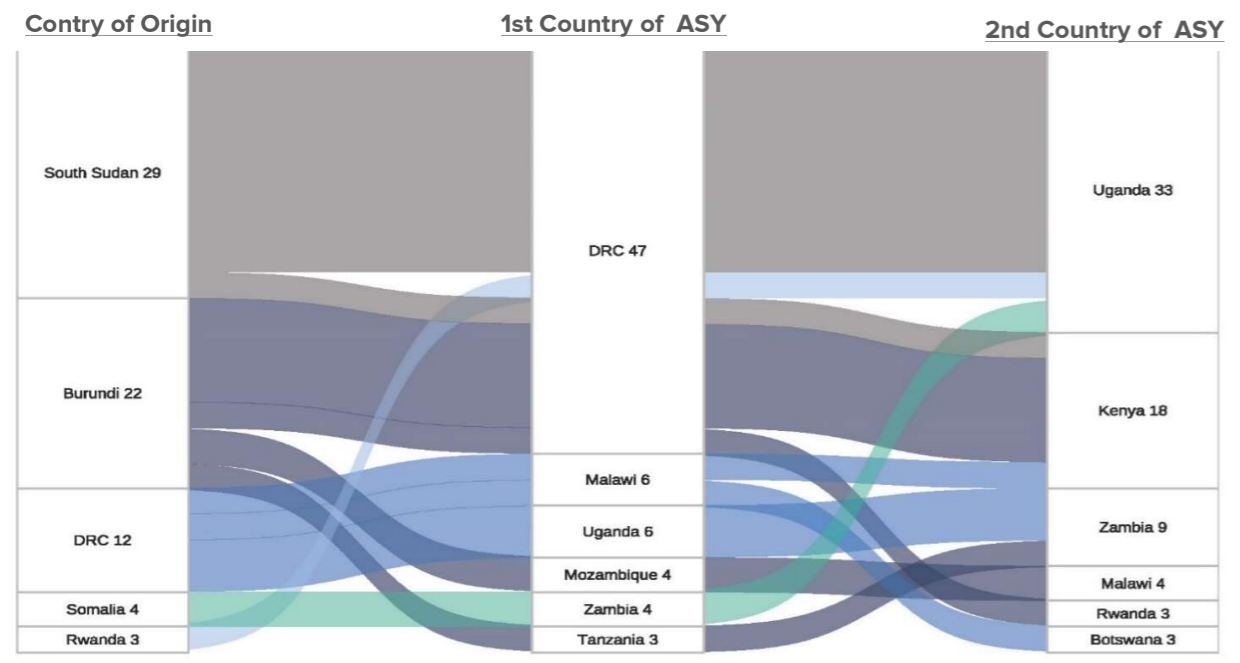

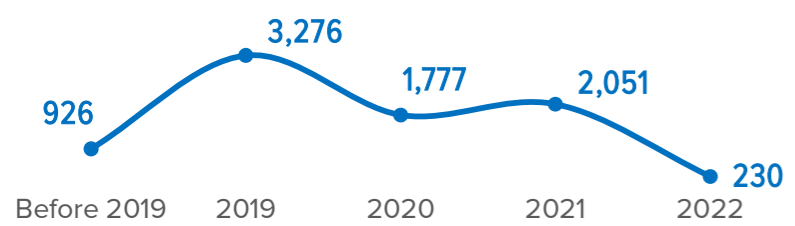
SECONDARY MOVEMENTS INVOLVING 3 POCs AND MORE *



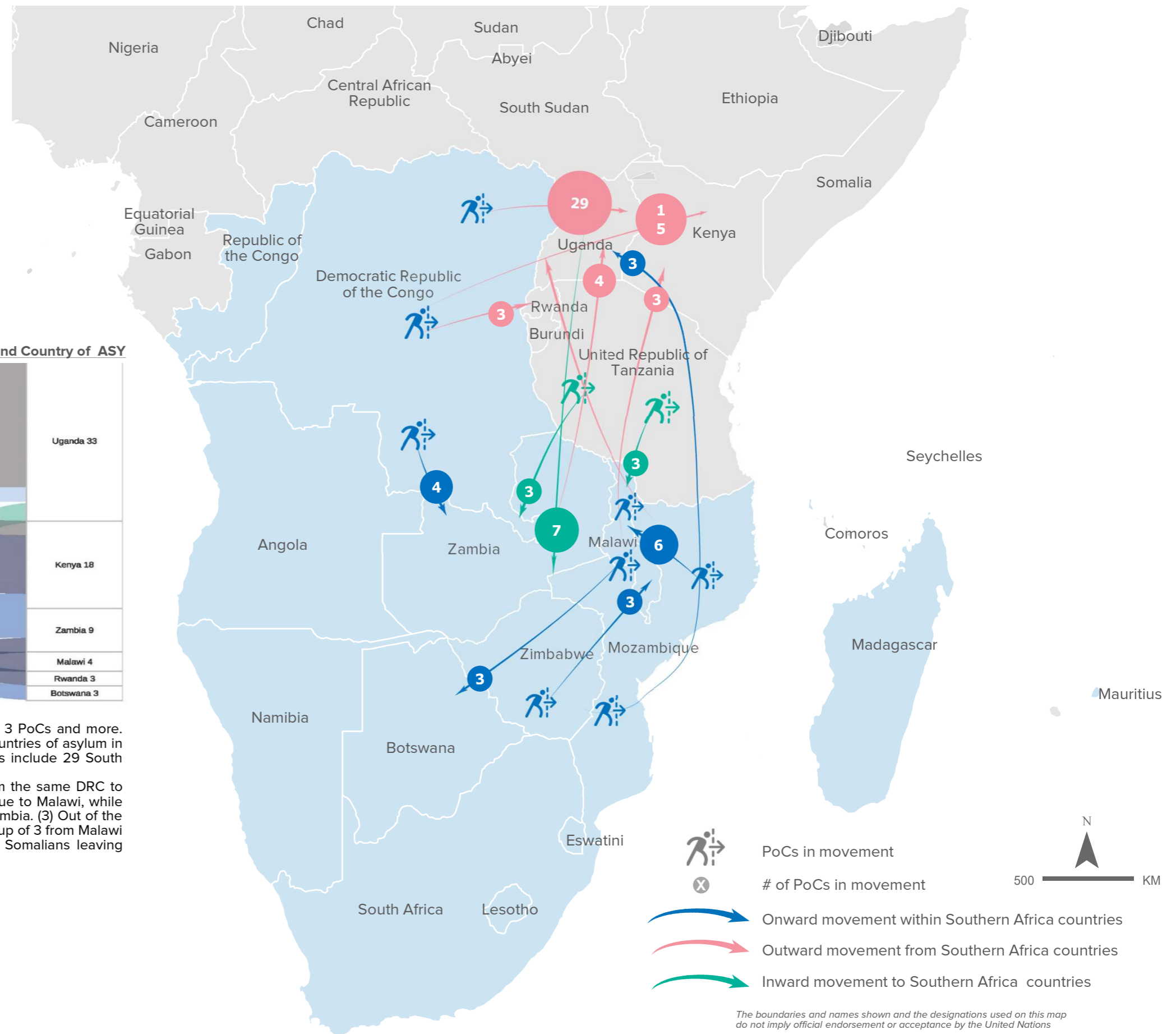
In February 2022, 70 PoCs from 5 nationalities have been involved in movement of 3 PoCs and more. Movements occurred from 6 countries of asylum (4 in Southern Africa Region) to 3 countries of asylum in the region and 3 other countries of asylum outside of the region. The 5 nationalities include 29 South Sudanese's, 22 Burundians, 12 Congolese's (DRC), 4 Somalians and 3 Rwandese's.

(1) Out of the 29 South Sudanese's, 26 went from DRC to Uganda while 3 went from the same DRC to Kenya. (2) Among the 22 Burundians, 12 went from DRC to Kenya, 4 from Mozambique to Malawi, while the remaining went in equal group of 3 from DRC to Rwanda and from Tanzania to Zambia. (3) Out of the 12 Congolese's, 6 came to Zambia from Uganda while the remaining went in equal group of 3 from Malawi to Botswana and Kenya. (4) The remaining 2 nationalities went all to Uganda, the Somalians leaving Zambia while the Rwandese's came from DRC.
