

## WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs increased from 252,600 to 266,600 this week.

Bago Region (East) experienced the largest increase due to clashes in recent weeks. Partners on the ground verified the presence of 12,300 people from 18 villages in the Mone area of Kyaukkyi Township. The exact number of IDPs is expected to be higher but prevailing security conditions do not allow for broad verification.

In Tanintharyi Region, 1,000 people from seven villages in Thayetchaung Township were displaced into the jungle.

In Mon State, about 1,500 people within Thaton Township were also displaced due to clashes.

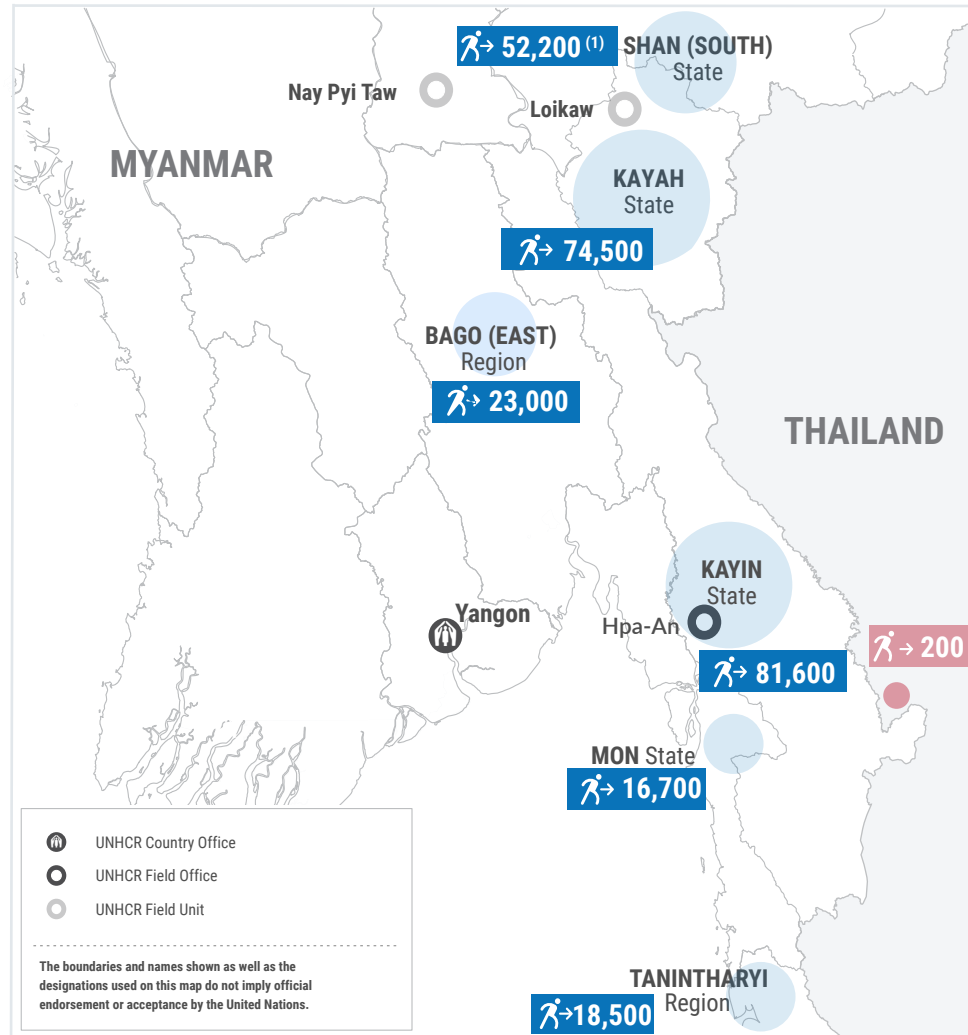
An additional 500 people from Thaton Township also fled towards Hpa-an Township in Kayin State.

In Kayah State, airstrikes in early July displaced about 600 people within Loikaw Township - at the same time, some 2,200 IDPs returned to their villages of origin following an improvement in the security situation.

In Kayin State, the recent intensifying clashes have resulted in cross-border movements. However, some 700 IDPs managed to return to their village of origin in Kayin State from Thailand's Tak Province.

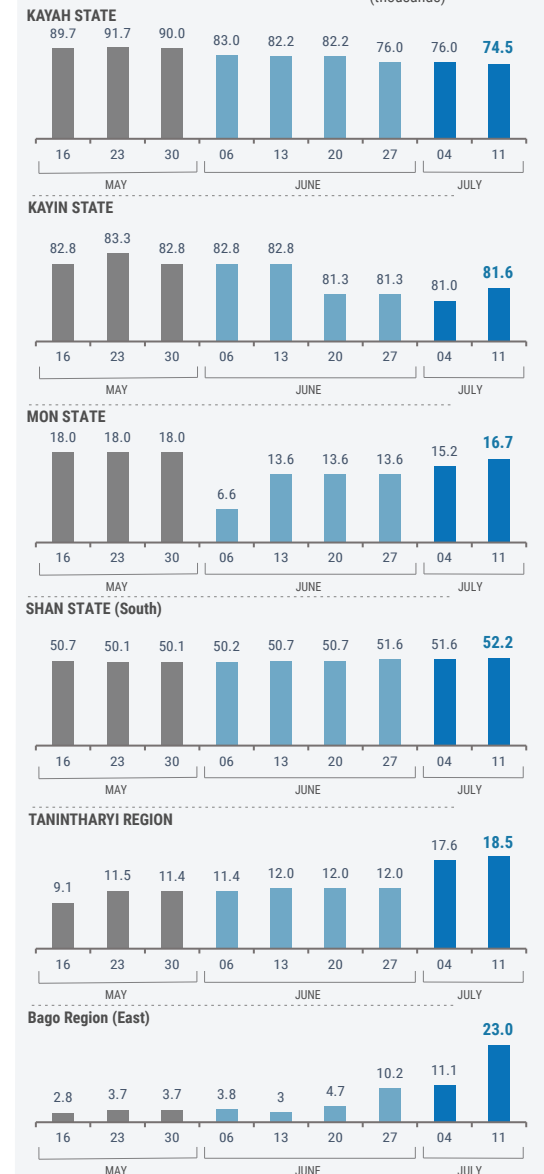
