An additional refugee influx is expected due to winter reasons. The estimated number of new arrivals is 40,000 in addition to the 89,000 refugees already in Moldova, and in top of regular fluctuations on refugee population. Planning assumptions include: Increasing inflation rate and prices. Increasing pressure on host communities.

- Impact of the energy crisis, and potential shortages on supply of gas, electricity and winter goods.
- Additional inflows from Ukraine during winter period, which may amount to 40,000 new refugees entering the country during the winter season in additional to underlying conflicted related trends.
- Movements of refugees from host communities/private accommodation to RACs.
- Difficulties to access the local labor market and/or sustainable sources of income by refugees an TCNs.

Priority populations (in addition to gender and age considerations):

Refugees

- Refugees in RACs: Roma community, older persons, persons with disabilities with proper considerations for gender and age.
- Refugees hosted by Moldovan households
- Refugees renting private accommodations without a stable source of income.

Moldovan host community:

- The following criteria should be taken into consideration when identifying potential beneficiaries: people with disabilities, members of minority groups, and households facing socio-economic hardship. Moldovan households hosting refugees.
- Moldovan households living in rural areas and in dwellings not fit for the winter period..

Additional gender and age considerations should be taken into account when targeting Moldovan.







Government Response

- Financial Aid for Winter Period: A monthly payment on the value of 700 MDL (36.5 USD) will be made to persons receiving state pensions and/or social allowances with low income from November 2022 to March 2022.
- Energy Vulnerability Reduction Fund: through the Energy Vulnerability Reduction Fund – approved in July 2022 – households facing energy vulnerability will be granted compensations for the payment of energy bills as a measure to reduce the impact of rising energy prices.
- Firewood price and distribution: Vulnerable households or those who heat
 exclusively with firewood will be able to buy up to 3 cubic meters of firewood
 at a fixed price during the first phase (October November). In a second
 phase (December January), the Government Forest Agency (Moldsilva) will
 provide additional volumes depending on the existing need and stocks.

Government needs

- Contributions to the Energy Vulnerability Reduction Fund
- Support to Refugee Accommodation Centers (RACs)
- Support to social institutions, such as health and educational facilities
- Support with awareness campaigns on rational consumption of energy and promotion of energy efficiency.

The IAC team will share the government's expressed needs with RFC members in the following days. Sector-Leads are strongly encouraged to liaise with their relevant sector government counterparts on winterization needs and ensure proper coordination with the government when developing the sector winterization strategy.

Partners inputs

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• Partners highlighted the necessity of working with government counterparts in order to clarify priority groups within the host communities.







	 Since many of the interventions are related to financial support (cash), NFIs, food, and Protection there is a strong emphasis to coordinate activities between main stakeholders. There are concerns regarding availability of winter related items in the market, including firewood and solid fuels. A winter assessment taskforce will meet on Tuesday (16) to coordinate assessment efforts on the context of the winterization process. A NFIs coordination meeting will take place on Wednesday 17 to discuss standard NFI packages, distribution strategies and coverage areas. Considering high risks pregnant women and newborns encounter in the winter, it's critical that strategies to mitigate risks are discussed in the Protection, Health and/or A&T WGs. Considering the anticipated energy crisis, communication with communities on energy reduction practices and other key messages are critical and should be further discussed in the AAP task force meeting.
