KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- Over 4,000 new refugees from Burkina Faso arrived in Côte d'Ivoire during the school year. As the newly arrived refugee children have not yet been enrolled in school, this explains the significant drop inenrolment rates compared to the 2020-2021 school year. 1,236 school-age Burkinabe refugees who recently arrived in Côte d'Ivoire are in urgent need of schooling.
- Refugees and asylum seekers in Côte d'Ivoire have access to primary and secondary education on the same basis as nationals. UNHCR provides financial support to all refugee and asylum-seeking students for registration fees and the purchase of school supplies.
- I9 refugees are beneficiaries of DAFI scholarships and 15 other refugee students have received one-time financial support for university enrolment. UNHCR continues to advocate with the State to allow refugees to access tertiary education under the same conditions as nationals.
