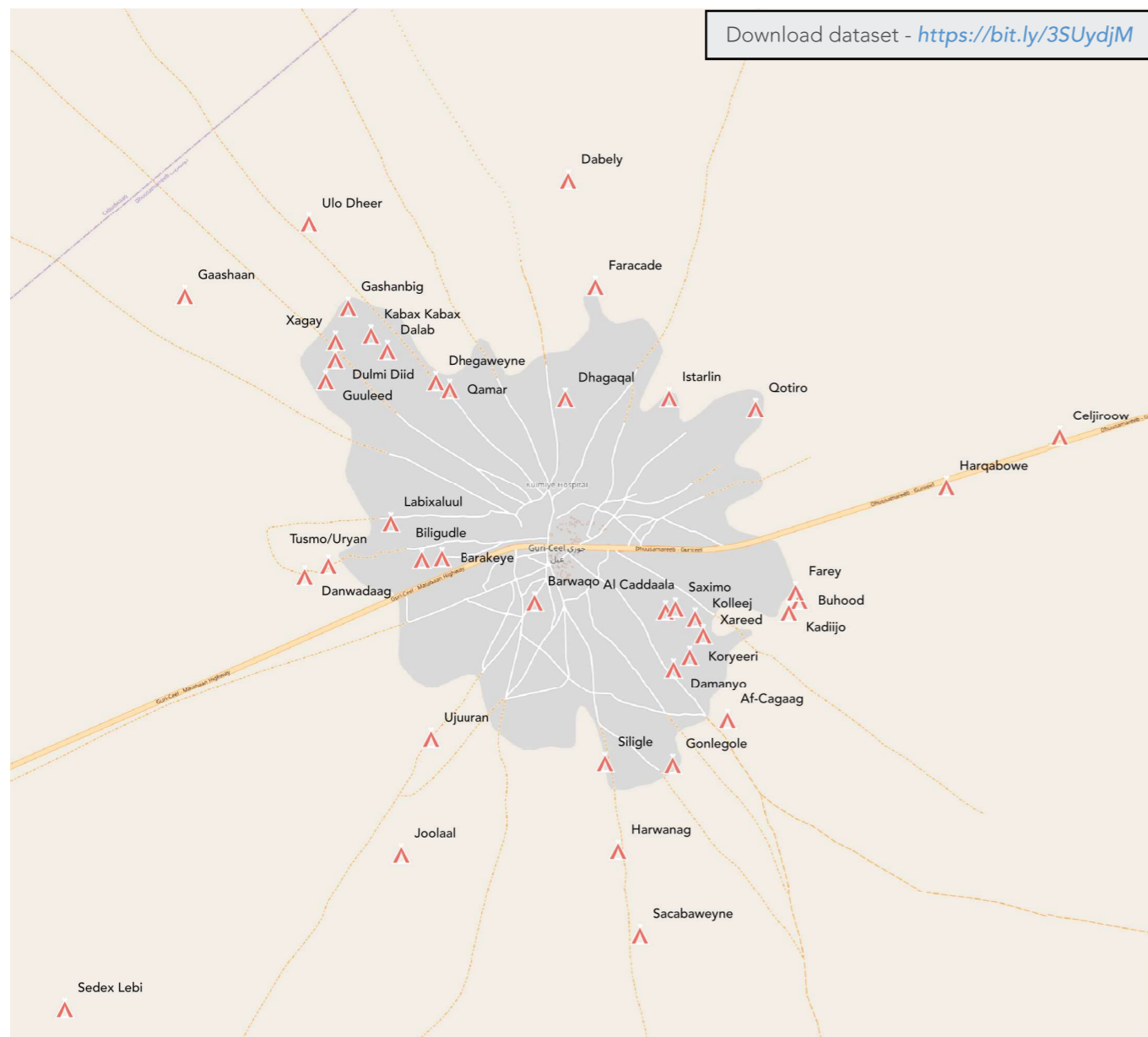

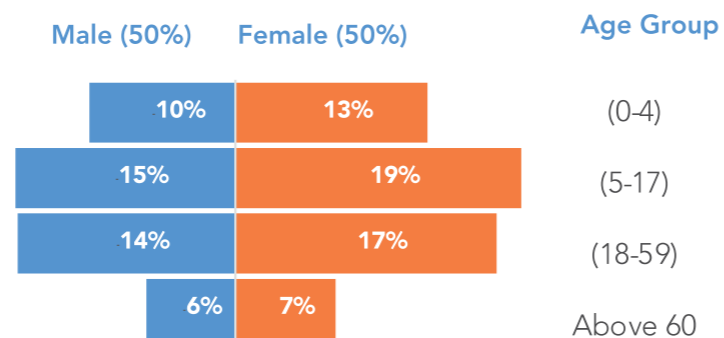
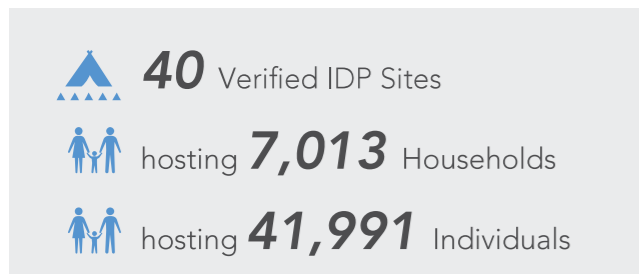


Map of verified IDP sites in Guriel - October 2022

Assessment overview

A joint IDP site verification exercise was conducted in Guriel in October 2022. The operation was led by the GCRI, APCC, GECPD, KAAH and NoFYL. 40 IDP sites were identified hosting 7,013 households or 41,991 individuals. Compared to the last Site Verification conducted in February 2022, there was an increase of 1 IDP sites and 1,545 individuals.

People living with disability

Using the Washington Group disability questions, statistics of people living with disabilities were derived

- 226 (50% Female)** have difficulty with seeing (even wearing glasses)
- 215 (48% Female)** have difficulty with hearing (even using a hearing aid)
- 185 (49% Female)** have difficulty with communicating and/or understanding
- 211 (53% Female)** have difficulty with walking and/or climbing stairs
- 181 (43% Female)** have difficulty with dressing and/or washing
- 148 (52% Female)** have difficulty with remembering/concentrating

Eviction Risk Mapping

IDP sites were assessed based on their risk of eviction. Several factors were put into consideration such as IDP site tenure, type of agreements in place and whether an eviction notice has been issued recently.

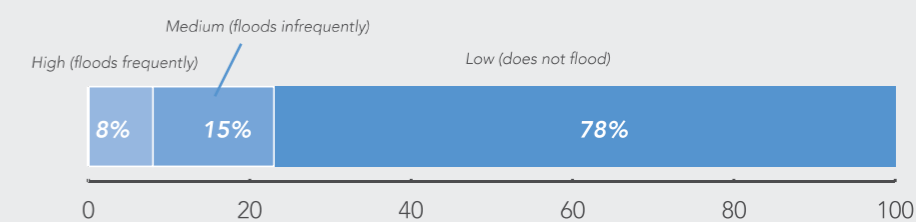
- 98%** of sites have communal ownership/permanent ownership
- 100%** of sites have no agreement in place
- 8%** of sites have been issued with eviction notice within the last 3 months

8% of IDP sites have been classified as having extreme (8%) and high (0%) risk of eviction

Flood Risk Mapping

IDP sites were assessed based on their risk of flooding.

3 IDP sites (8%) have been classified as extreme (always floods) and high (floods frequently)
