

Number of patients receiving ART in war-affected regions



National Response

- GFATM allocated EUR 1mln for HIV and TB prevention and support programs for refugees
- Ministry of Health issued the Disposition nr. 443-d, on active interventions for HIV and TB prevention in RACs with the involvement of specialized NGOs
- National program for prevention and control of HIV/AIDS an STIs provides free diagnosis and treatment
- UNAIDS supports the HIV community based emergency response implemented by 10 national and local NGOs

Results

More than 5000 refugees were covered with integrated services by NGOs:

- HIV
- TB
- Mental Health,
- Sexual and reproductive health
- PSEA

By the end of October 2022, the governmental National AIDS program, provided continuous ARV treatment for more than 200 of refugees.


