<b>Coordination updates (AI Updates, updates from the field)</b>	<p>ActivityInfo:                      Last updated on 24th October. 13 agencies submitted their planning in 10 locations across Jordan. 60% of target achieved in the first 4 indicators, 92% satisfaction of clients towards GBV case management.</p> <p>Resilience indicators: some organizations (6) planned for these interventions, but nothing has been added on this - if it is because no activity was done then it should be reported as 0. Some partners who appealed during the SRP 2020/2022 did not upload their data under the AI system and the focal points should flag if there are issues. Reporting is very important as data is shared with donors and stakeholders and informs the wider UNHCR dashboards. UNHCR will share with members dates for the next training on the system. There are still no news from MOPIC on the next JRP – important to address gaps in the reporting ahead of appeal for next cycle.</p>	<b>Organizations to ensure reporting in Activity Info</b>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- In the last indicator it is important to add the value in percentage (% of clients demonstrating satisfaction towards GBV Case management)</li> <li>- Reporting was opened for the 3 past months, not possible to re-open it for Q3 but in Q4 the data can be entered not to lose the entries.</li> </ul> <p>Q: Is AI exclusive on service delivery or can orgs report on other types of interventions?  A: Activities are divided by sector, but indicators are limited so if you cannot find your activity there you can report them on the platform Services Advisor.</p> <p>Azraq and EJC camps:  Last CP&amp;GBV meeting was held on 19/10 in Azraq with the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- VAC SoP's in the schools and the referral pathway</li> <li>- RYSE Project Villages 2 &amp; 3 – DRC</li> <li>- CP-GBV Safe Referral Training – UNHCR (taking place on October 30th)</li> <li>- 16 Days of Activism</li> <li>- Sexual Harassment on the way to the school.</li> <li>- EJC Updates (TDH &amp; NHF)</li> </ul> <p>EJC monthly coordination meeting took place on 17/10 with the following agenda:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 16 Days of Activism</li> <li>- Info-Sessions</li> <li>- Challenges</li> <li>- Agency updates</li> </ul> <p>Mafraq:  During the last meeting it was discussed the engagement of the group on the campaign on 16 days through FGDs (4) to brainstorm ideas and it was decided to have a joint event at the local level on 4th of December in schools.</p> <p>Irbid:  The CP &amp; GBV monthly meeting was held on the 12th of October, with a presentation from UNRWA and one the 2021 GBVIMS report. A first meeting was also conducted on the campaign 16 days and a joint activity has been decided.</p>	
<b>Presentation of Cash and GBV Guidelines</b>	Presentation on the new guidance note on Cash-based assistance and GBV Case Management, a product of the Jordan GBV Working Group, Cash for Protection Taskforce and GBVIMS Taskforce. The	

	last comments following a round of feedback collection from the 3 groups will be answered and the document will then be shared in the UNHCR SWG platform.	
<b>Updates on Amaali app</b>	<p>Organizations were trained on the use of the Amaali app, but the data were entered in 2019 and not updated since, with most organizations changing the focal point. As a result, case managers have found it difficult to use the app as most contacts were outdated.</p> <p>Each organization should ensure to have a focal point and to add/change data. Humanitarian staff have to sign up on the platform through their official email (the personal one would not be accepted by the system).</p> <p>A new feature has been added in the app, a chatbot (implemented by AWO) through which beneficiaries can engage with operators that will provide counseling on available services and conduct referrals - important in particular for survivors living in the remote areas and those who do not have phone credit (only data), as well as those who would like to remain anonymous.</p> <p>Refresher session on use of the app were asked in Mafraq, and UNHCR is working on a plan to disseminate the new feature of the app (e.g. through poster) and to ensure that organizations scheduling awareness sessions on the App mention this function. An Arabic user manual has been developed and it will be shared – ensure that focal points receive it.</p>	
<b>Women’s work, women’s political participation and GBV – presentation from JWU</b>	<p>Presentation given by JWU in Arabic, looking at how the lack of recognition of women’s participation in economic and political spheres links to forms of GBV.</p> <p>Arabic PPT and study to be shared, English version not available yet.</p>	
<b>16 Days of Activism</b>	<p>Meeting every Wednesday from 10.00 to 11.30 with a group of organizations involved in activities as part of the campaign and in particular the joint event – reach out to SWG co-chairs if others want to join. Global theme on uniting for action to end violence against women, with a focus on WROs and activists leading the efforts. .</p> <p><a href="#">Calendar</a> shared with Taskforce members so that each orgs can add their proposed individual intervention, in addition to a joint event (either 1st or 5th of December, date to be confirmed but, if</p>	

	possible, avoid such dates for local events). Messages will be developed in conjunction with communities and visibility materials as well.	
<b>GBV SWG Capacity Building plan</b>	Update on proposed calendar: shift to Q1 2023 of training on Engaging men and boys to prevent GBV. WG will be organizing Iteragency Case management Training	
<b>AOB</b>	<p>AIDOS: guidelines on GBV, disability and COVID19 have been finalized (pending final approval from High Council for Persons with Disabilities) and the English and Arabic versions to be shared soon (by December 2022).</p> <p>UNHCR Mafraq has now established an external help desk at the partner location to ensure improved outreach.</p> <p>Next meeting is scheduled for the 29th of November.</p>
