

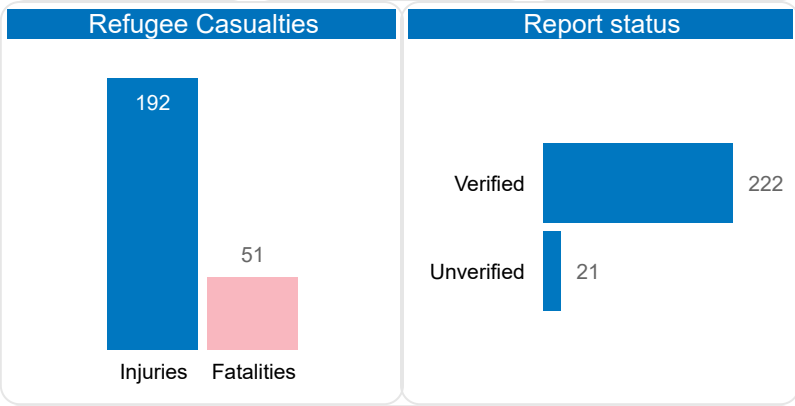

Overview of Incidents mapped

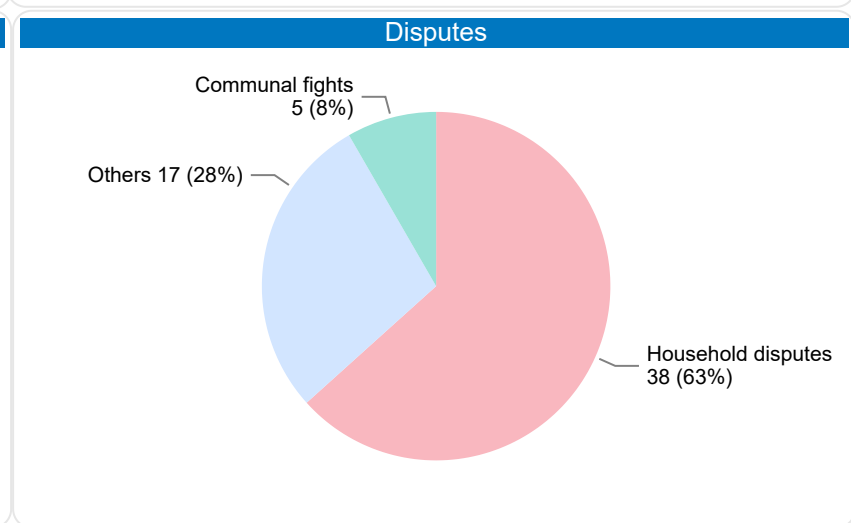
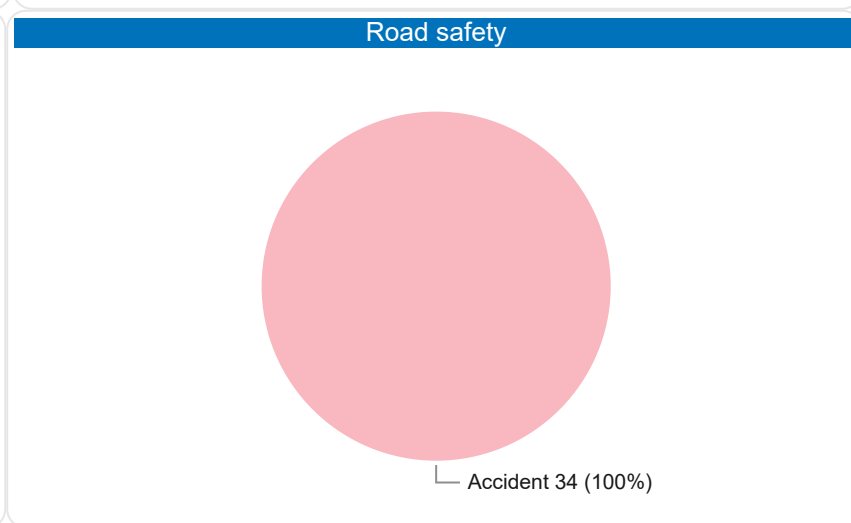
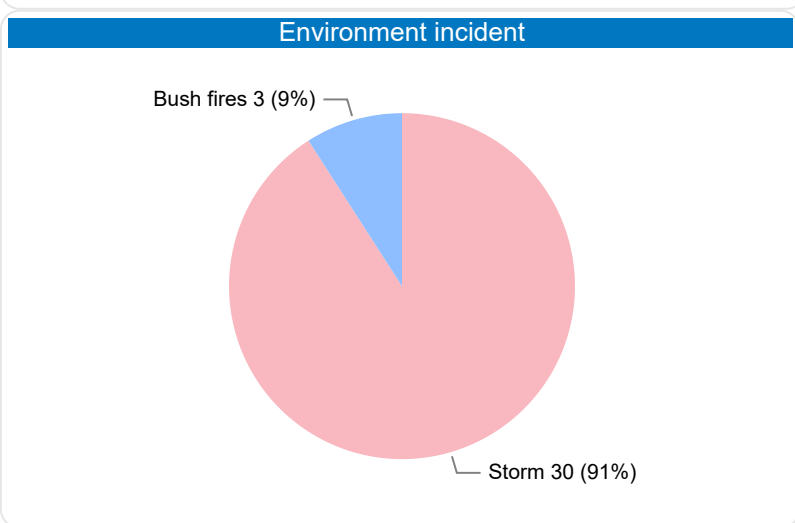
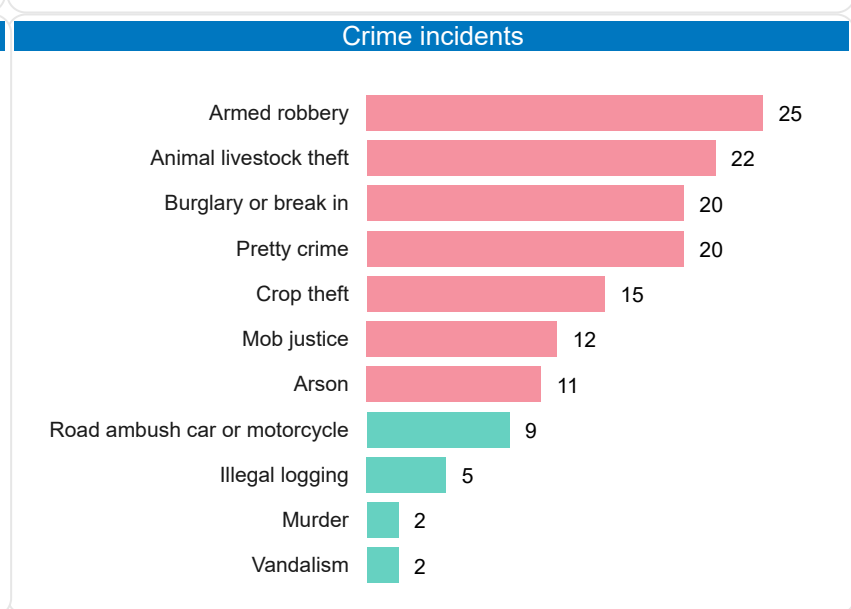
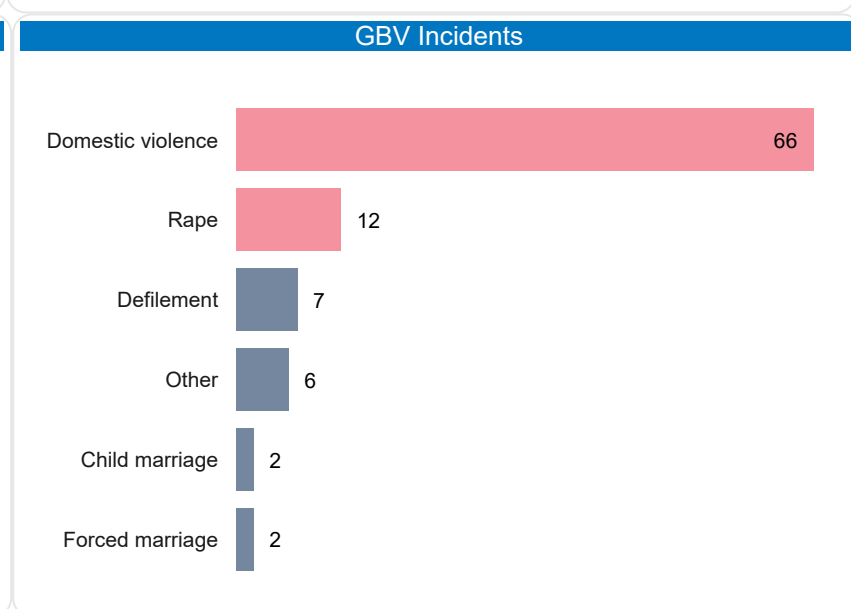
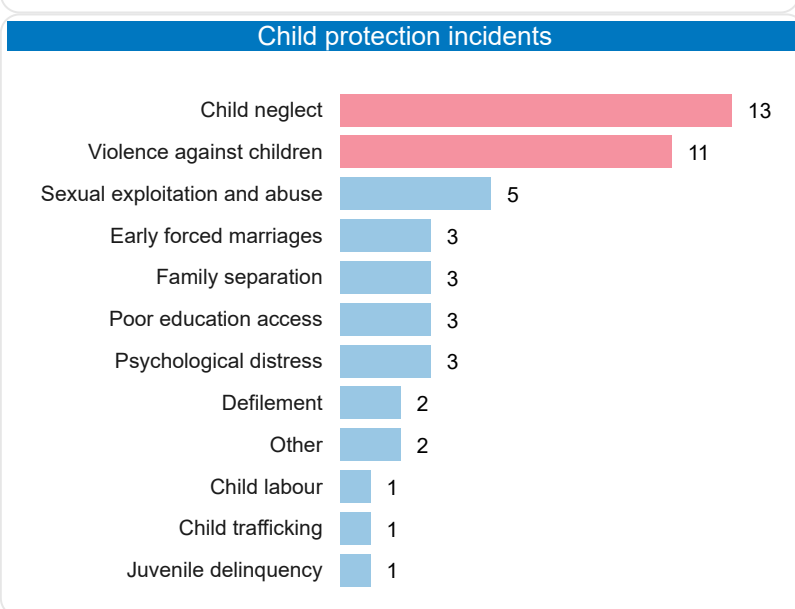
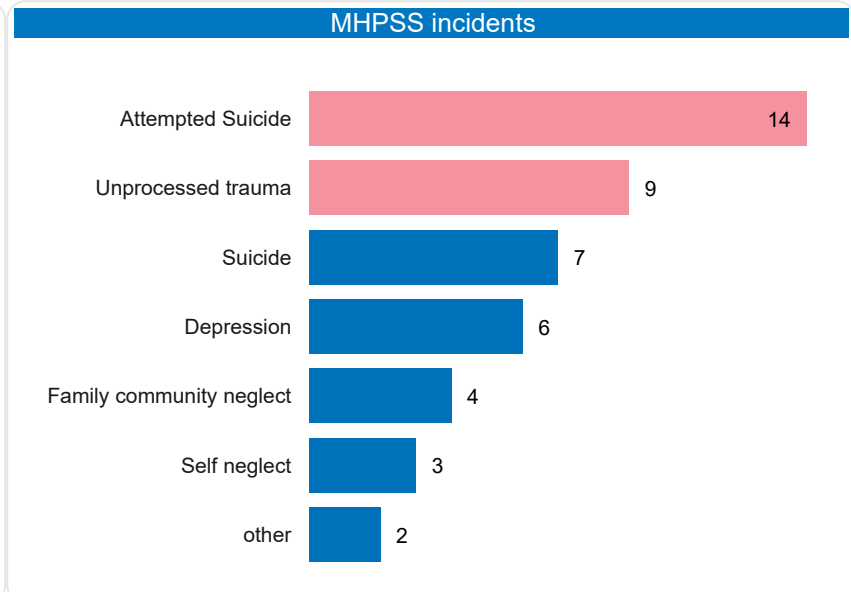
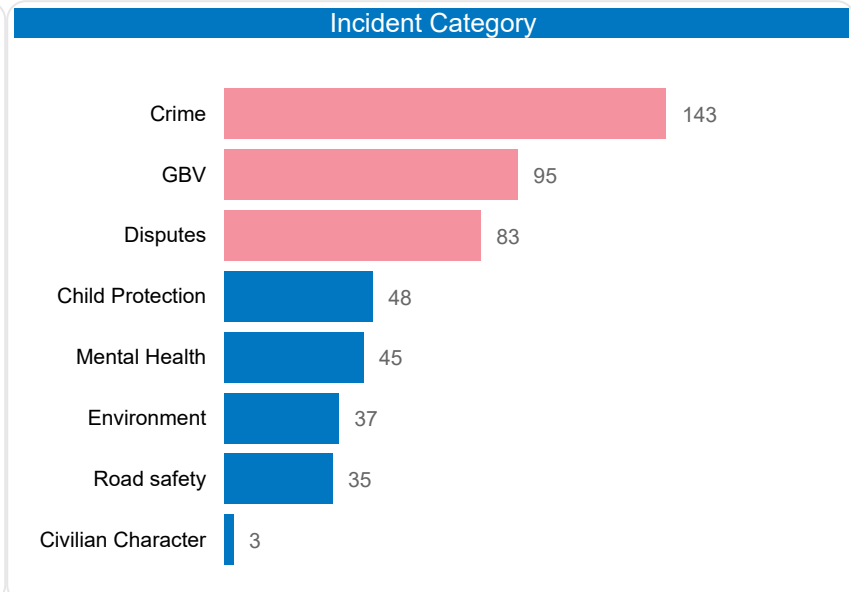
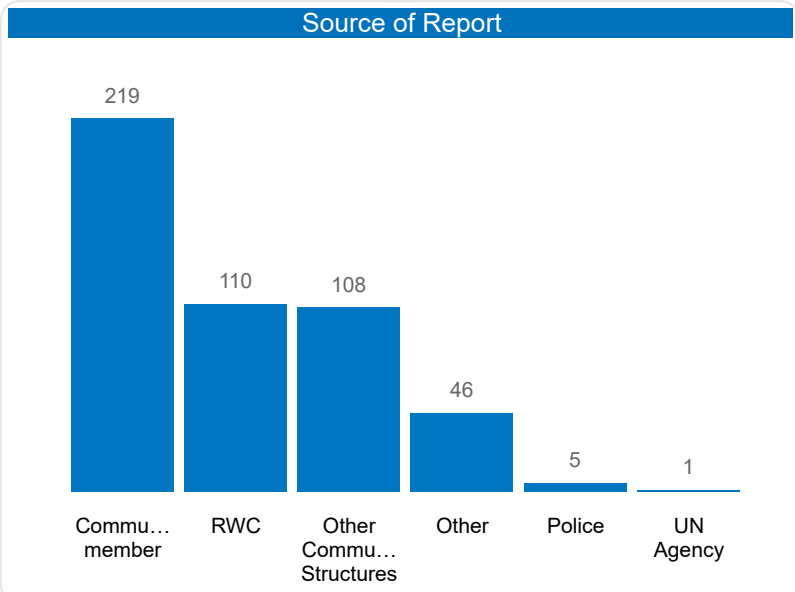
Twenty five (25) incidents were mapped in December 2022 down from 26 and 52 in November and October respectively. Implying a significant decrease in incidents in last quarter of 2022. This brings the cumulative number of incidents reported from January – December 2022 to 489.

Crime was the leading incident reported with 143 cases including armed robbery, animal/livestock theft, Petty crime, burglary or break in, crop theft, mob justice, arson, and road ambush on motor vehicles. 95 GBV cases comes second with domestic violence and rape as the top two incidents reported. 83 cases of Disputes in households ranked third.

The community mainly attributes the upsurge to the current economic crisis rendering refugees and host communities susceptible to negative coping mechanisms intensified by reduction of food rations for refugees by 50%.

Most of the incidents were registered in Zone II and Zone 1. Affected persons were advised to report incidents to the nearest Police posts for legal redress. Youth groups have continued to actively participate in community watch group activities in collaboration with security stakeholders to minimize associated risks.

The community recommends for intensified Police night Patrols and Community Policing sessions to curb incidents. Night Patrols have been done, though not on daily basis. Police Officers cite inadequate fuel for the patrols.
