Operational update	ICRC:	
from the members	 RAC managers are showing concern in accepting persons with disabilities and chronic disease in the RAC because it is very complicate the management of those cases. The RAC manager highlighted that cannot provide the medical and personal support those people need. Question from ICRC: if a person needs to obtain medication what is the process to access to medication? The process is to request to the family doctor for the prescription, but the person need to anticipate the costs from his/her side. That's why there is the need from organizations to support people in needs of medicine. 	The task force is working with the Accommodation and Transportation WG to create a list of accessible RAC with specific services available for different type of disabilities to facilitate the organizations is address those people in the right RAC





- ICRC is moving people with disabilities and chronic disease from the Railways hospital to other centers but struggling to finds suitable solutions and accessible centers.

CCSM Botanica:

- CCSM Botanica is working with IOM and ministry of health providing medication for mental health cases not only for acute cases but also for sustainable treatment.
- The project is providing medication, consultation, and treatment country wise through Mental Health Community Centers.

Keystone Moldova

- Keystone will continue its work in 2023 through mobile team in the north, center, and south part of Moldova.
- Support with medications and heating material for the winter.
- Keystone has a mobile accessible van from February and Keystone is looking for partners that have activities with persons with disabilities but not have an adapted van for transportation.

AOPD:

- The 31st of January AOPD with European Disability Forum will present the results of the project implemented in 2022.

HelpAge:





	 HelpAge is providing food in 27 RACs and can support and facilitate the accessibility assessment in the RAC where they are working. Clear Global Providing language and communication for humanitarian work in Moldova. Clear Global is working in 2023 to understand how facilitate better information sharing among refugees and in particular how to ensure the information would be accessible.
