Coordination updates (AI Updates, updates from the field)	<p>ActivityInfo: 14 agencies submitted info across 24 locations in Jordan with 81,812 beneficiaries reached in 2022. Zaatari, Amman and Azraq are the most targeted locations. Some indicators are not completely achieved (only the one on prevention and empowerment activities) and important to flag that some organizations submitted planning but did not report on it.</p> <p>The GoJ confirmed the extension of the JRP for 2023, before the Global Refugee Forum (Dec. 2024) the Government might embark on further revisions. Co-chairs will notify members when the planning on ActivityInfo will open for 2023.</p> <p>Zaatari: members to provide inputs on WP and TORs, which has been shared, as there are some major differences compared to last year in terms of service delivery.</p> <p>Azraq: NHF/GBV project is concluded. NHF will provide GBV case management services from Dec. 2022 until May 2023 (V3 and V6) with 1 case manager and 1 volunteer. In 2022 37 GBV cases received cash assistance (5650 JOD). 3 PSEA trainings will be organized for 75 security staff in Azraq.</p>	Organizations to ensure reporting in Activity Info

GBV SWG Coordination Survey 2022 Results.	<p>Presentation of a report showing the results of a yearly survey conducted by the GBV sub-working group to get its members' feedback on the performance of the SWG during 2022. The goal is to keep improving its work on the core functions for the next year, focusing on the SWG's strengths, weaknesses and areas for improvement. 37 participants submitted their inputs, providing key insights on the performance of the SWG, including their top suggestions for areas of work in 2023.</p>	<p>Report available here.</p>

Campaigning (Upcoming International Women's Day)	<p>UNFPA briefing on this year's theme "<i>DigitALL: Innovation and technology for gender equality</i>" and proposed activities in particular on raising awareness on technology-facilitated GBV and impact on women and girls' rights (as closely linked to the area of interest of the SWG).</p> <p>UN Women will have activities in all their OASIS centers, they are interested in seeing if others also want to join in the community outreach activities.</p> <p>Azraq will discuss in the next WGs meeting on the proposed activities consulting with refugees. Mafraq will organize a meeting with partners to discuss this.
